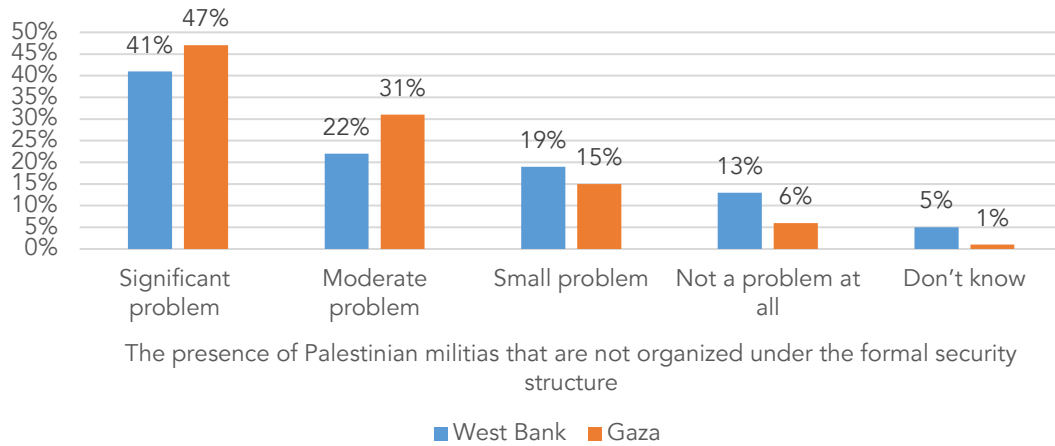

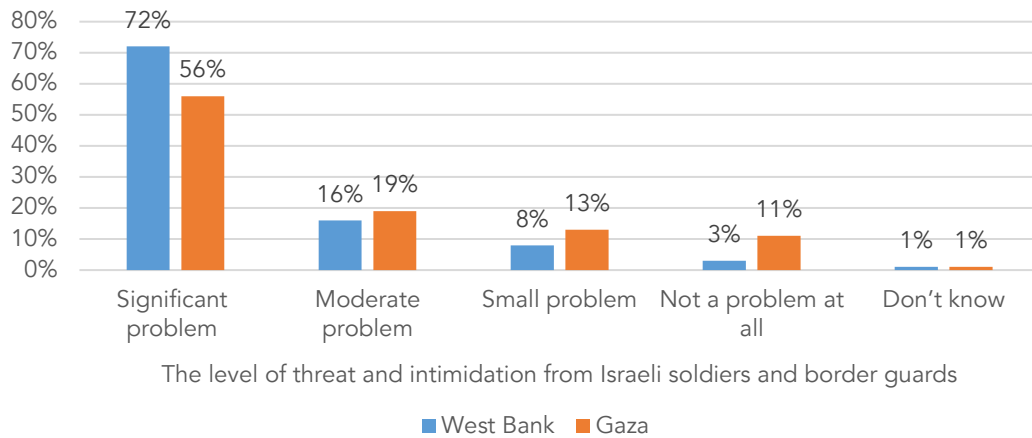

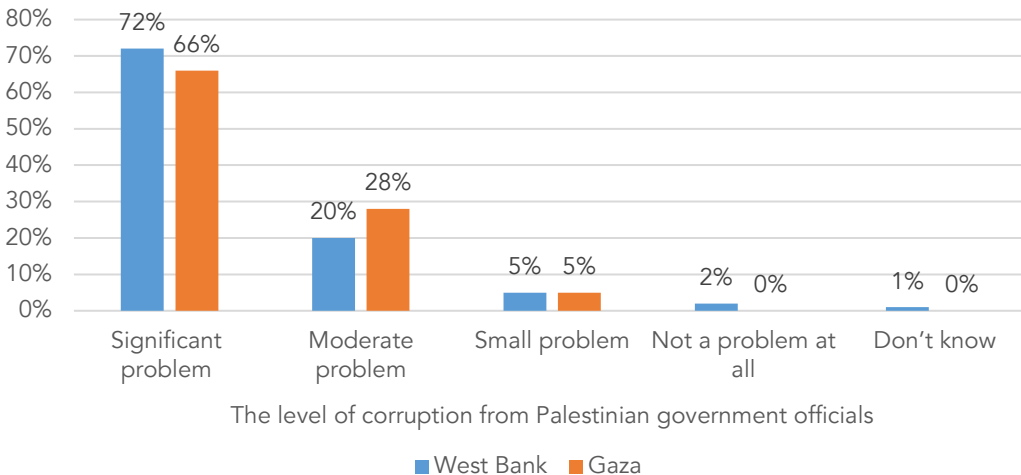
How significant or insignificant is the presence of Palestinian militias in your area?



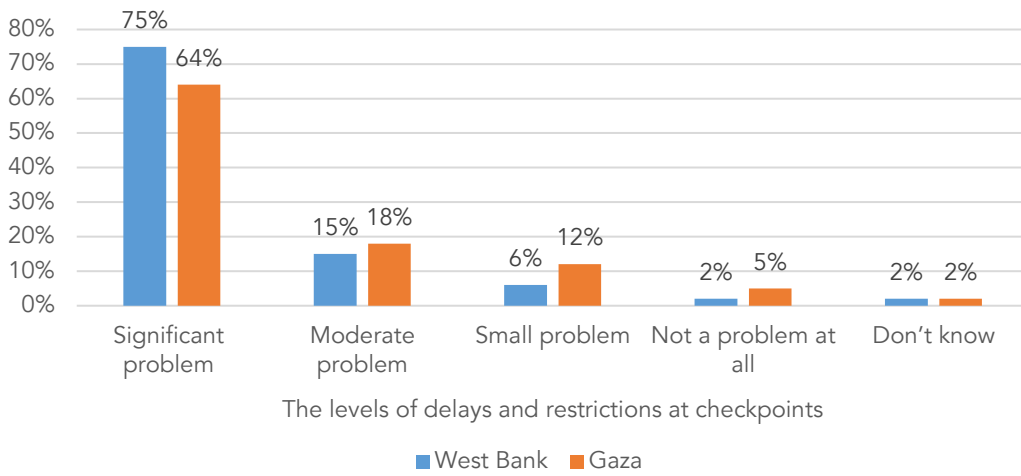
How significant or insignificant are the levels of threat from Israeli soldiers in your area?



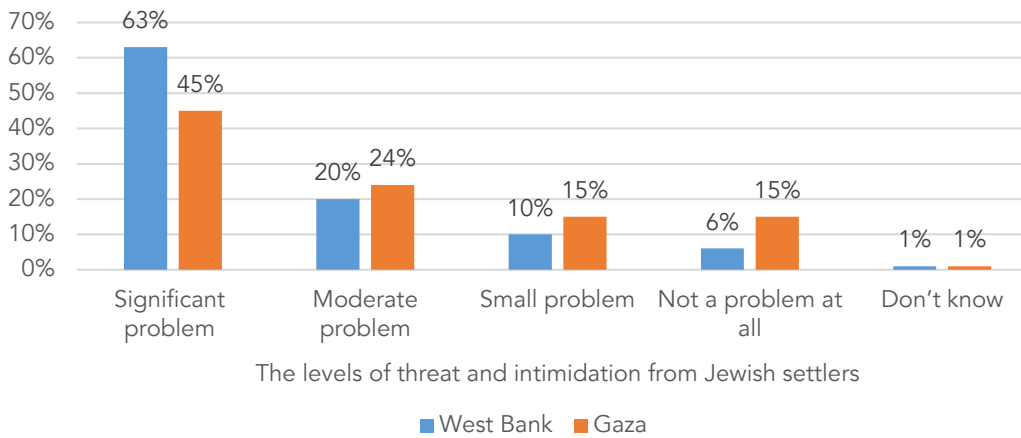
How significant or insignificant is the level of corruption in your area?



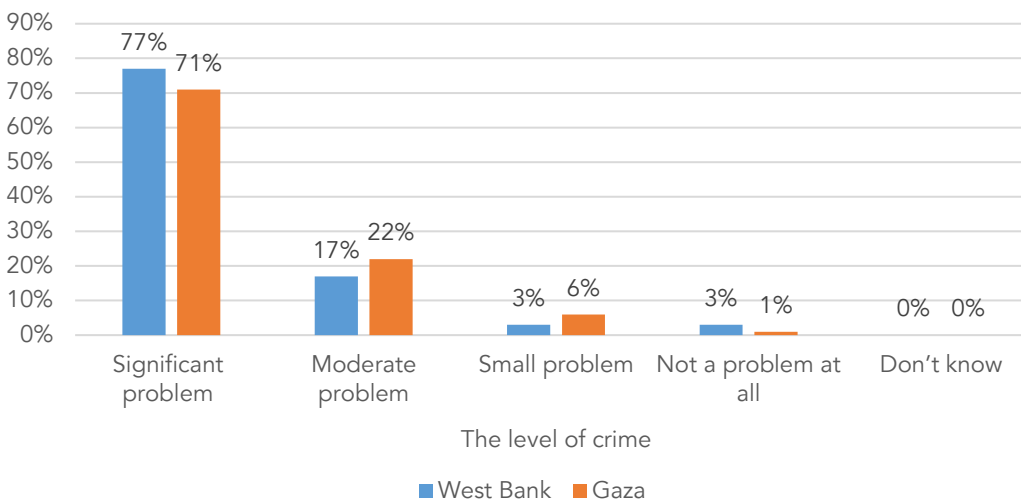
How significant are the levels of delays at checkpoints in your area?

How significant or insignificant is the level of crime in your area?

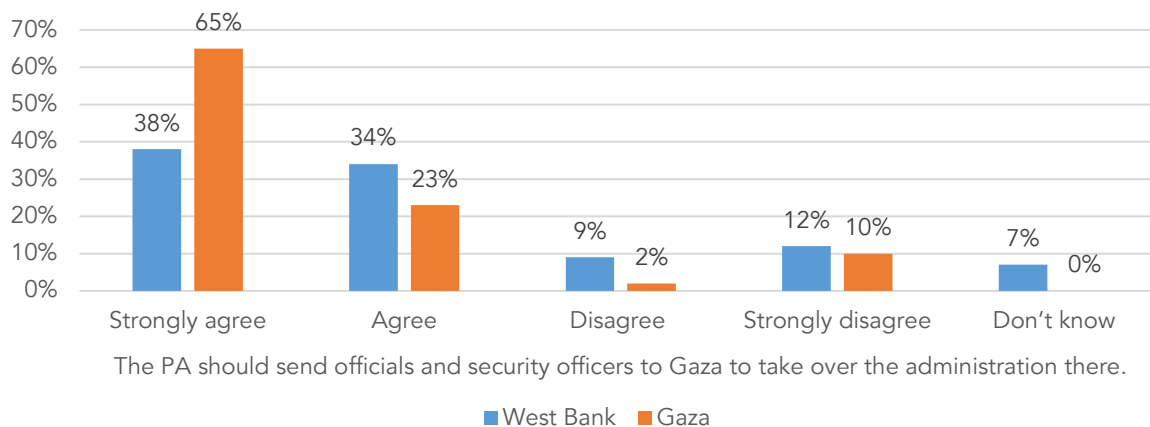

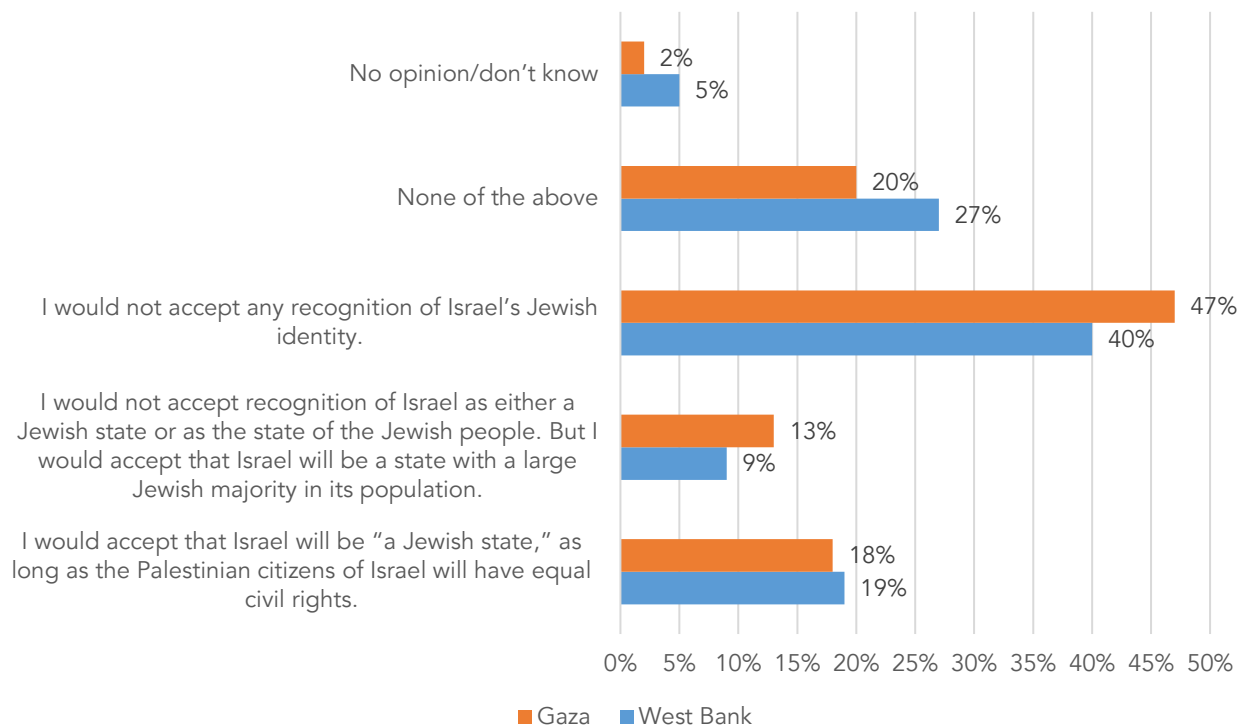

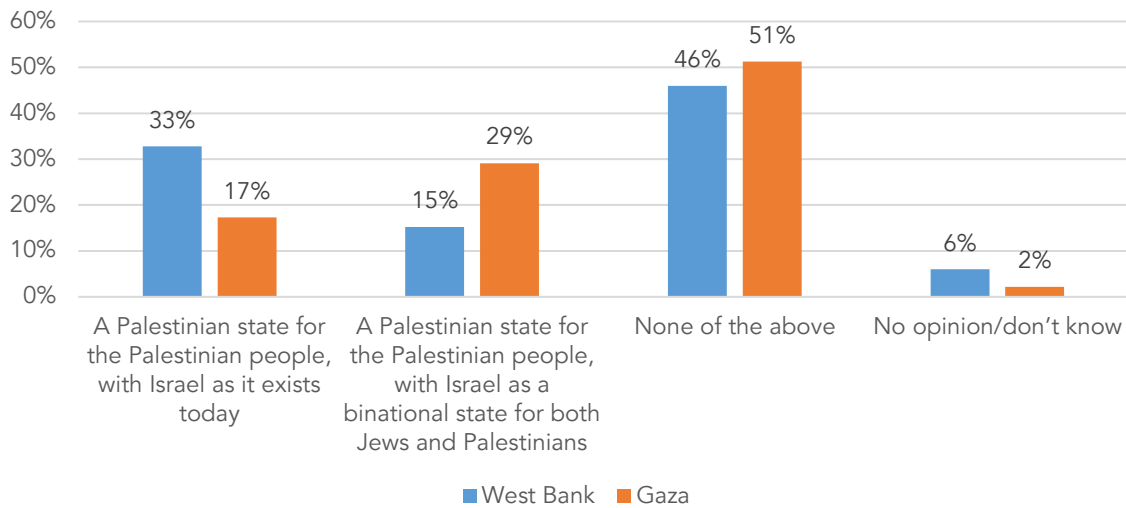

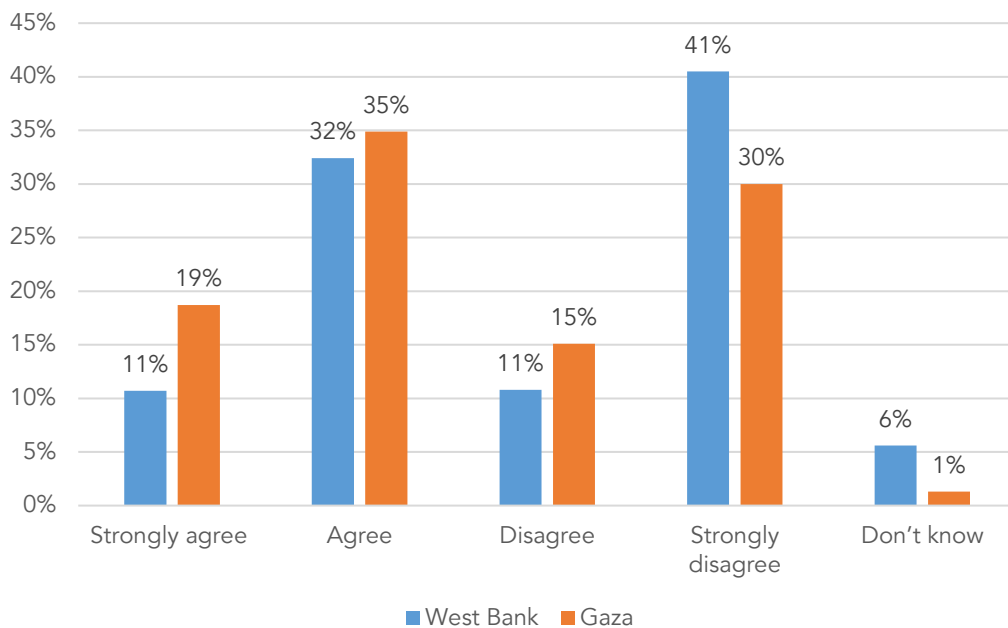

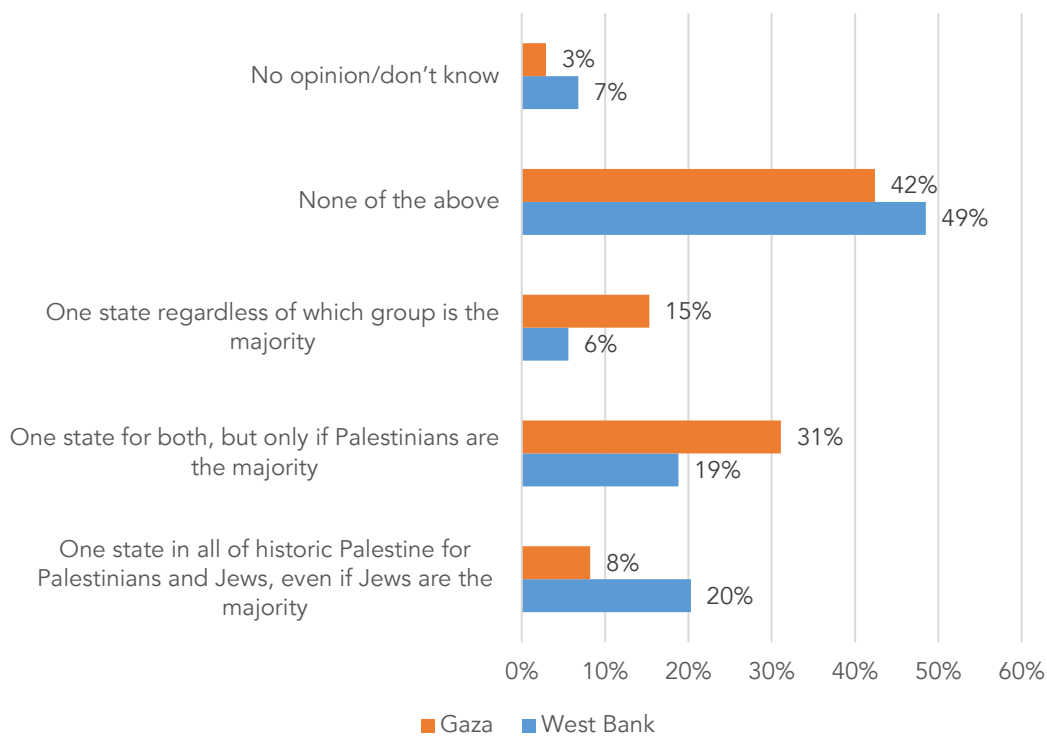

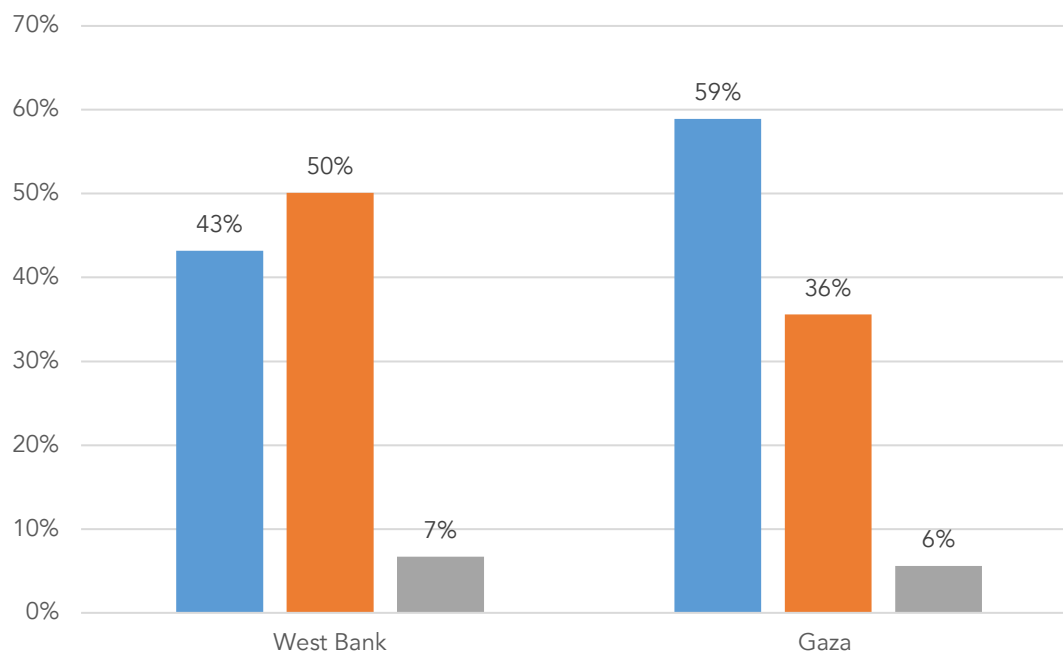

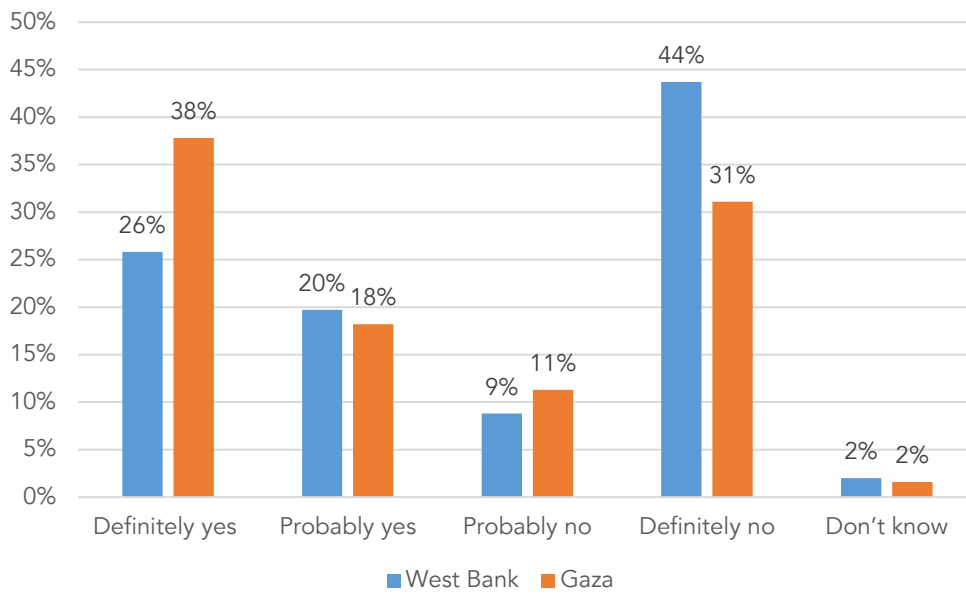

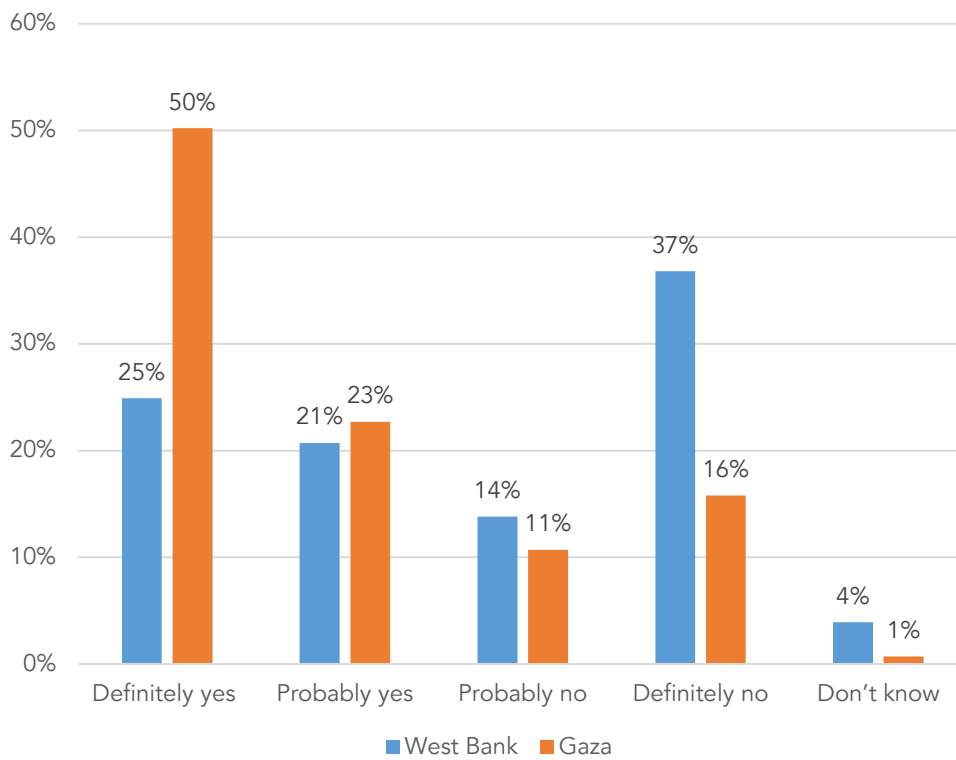

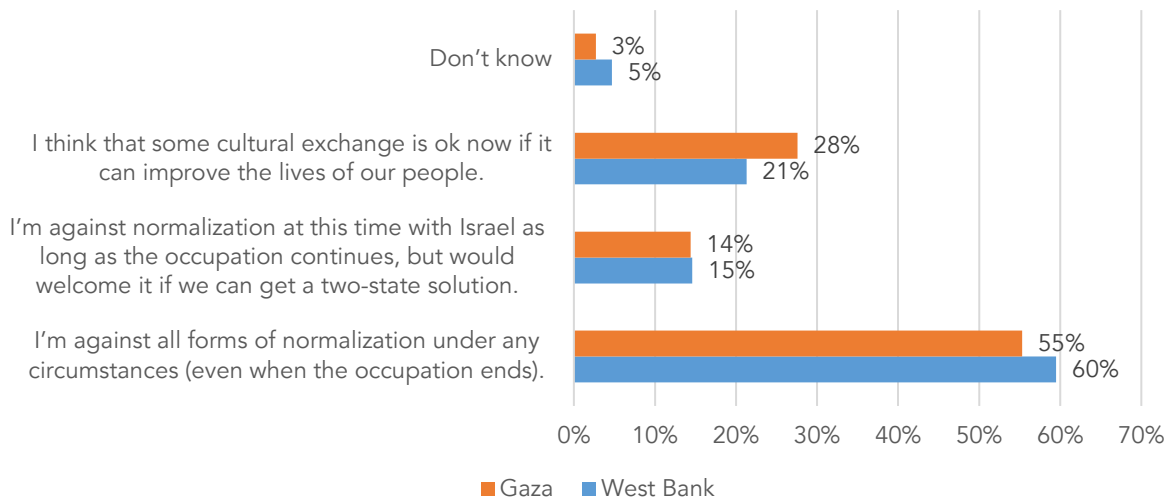

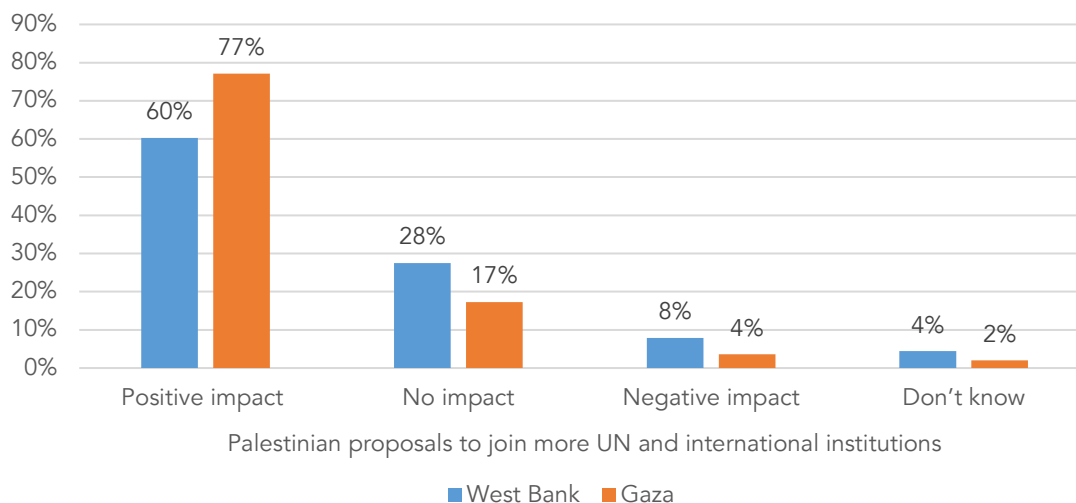

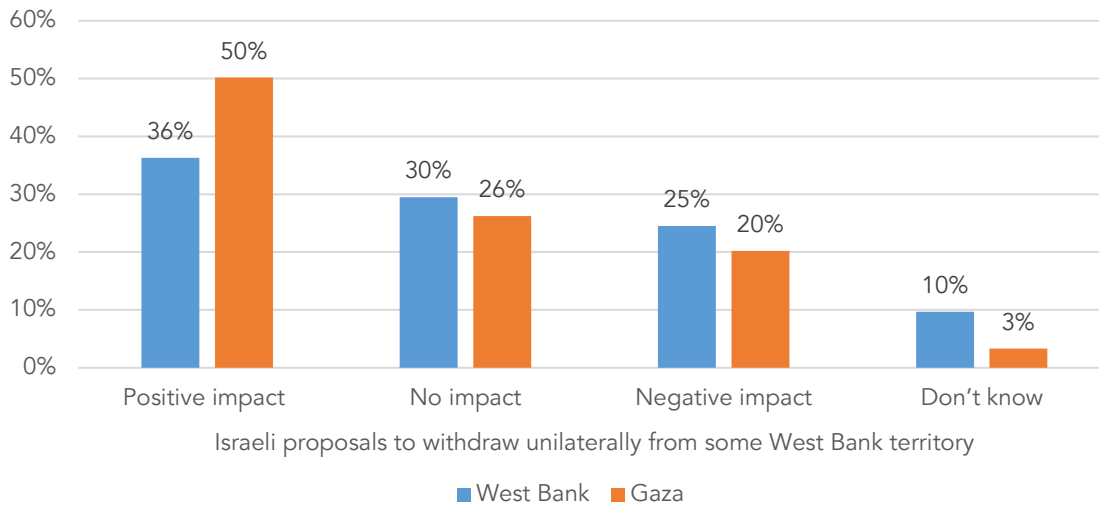
### Israeli proposals to annex some West Bank settlements



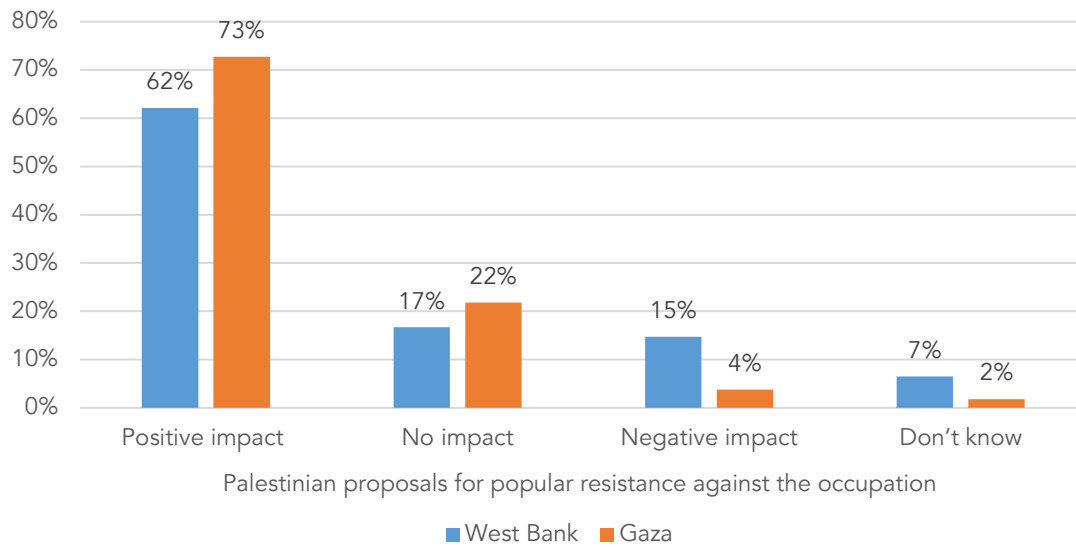

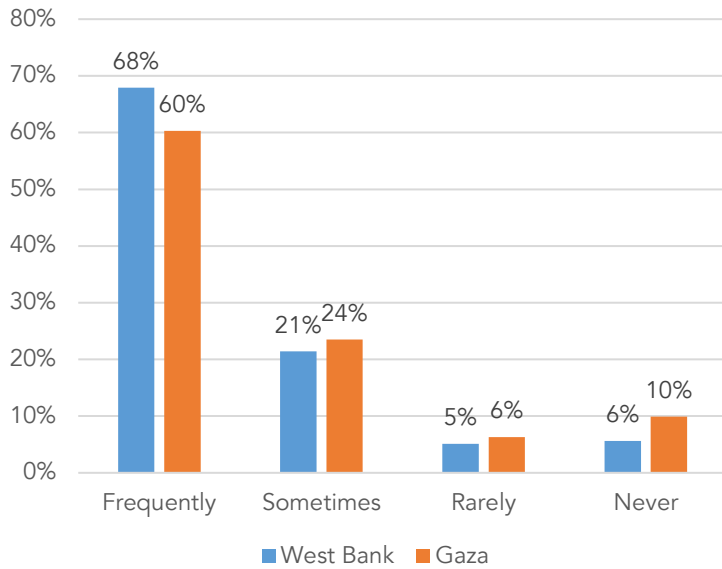

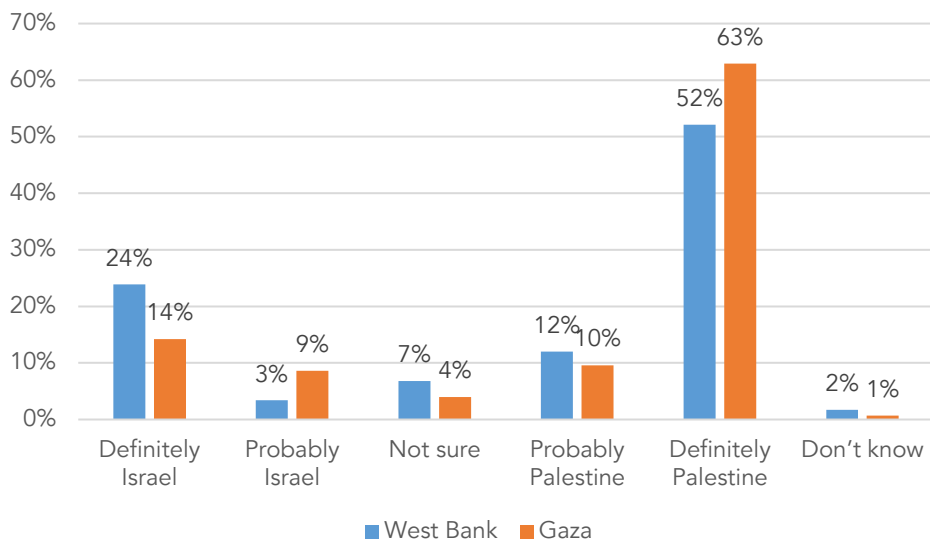

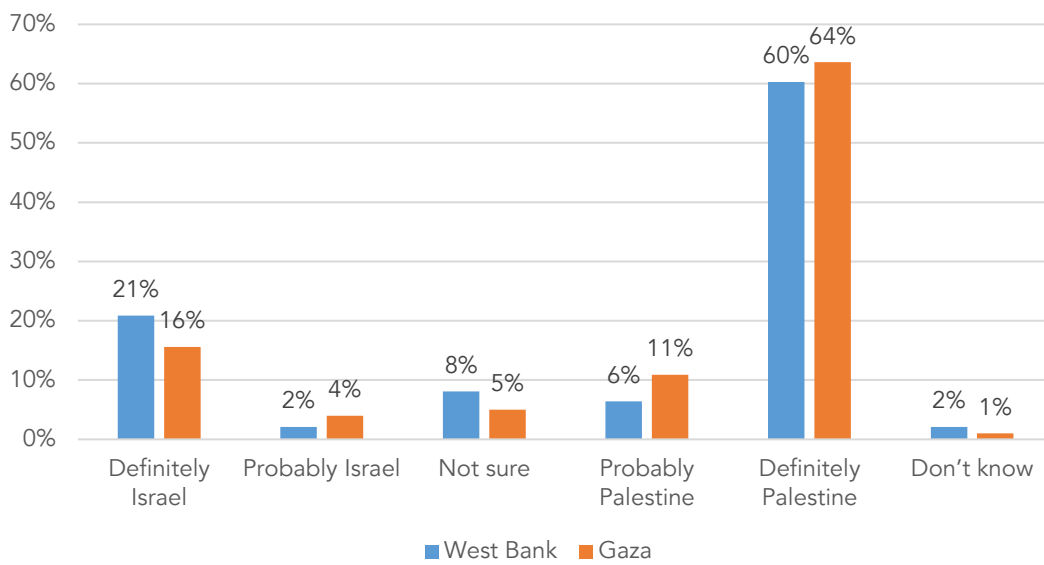
