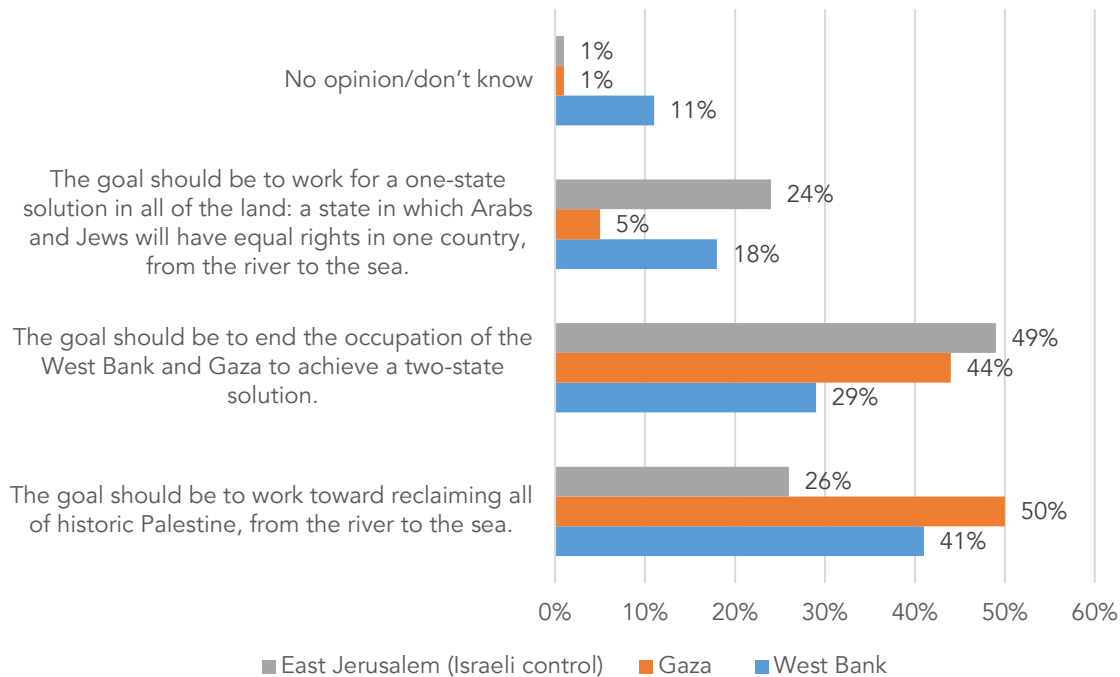

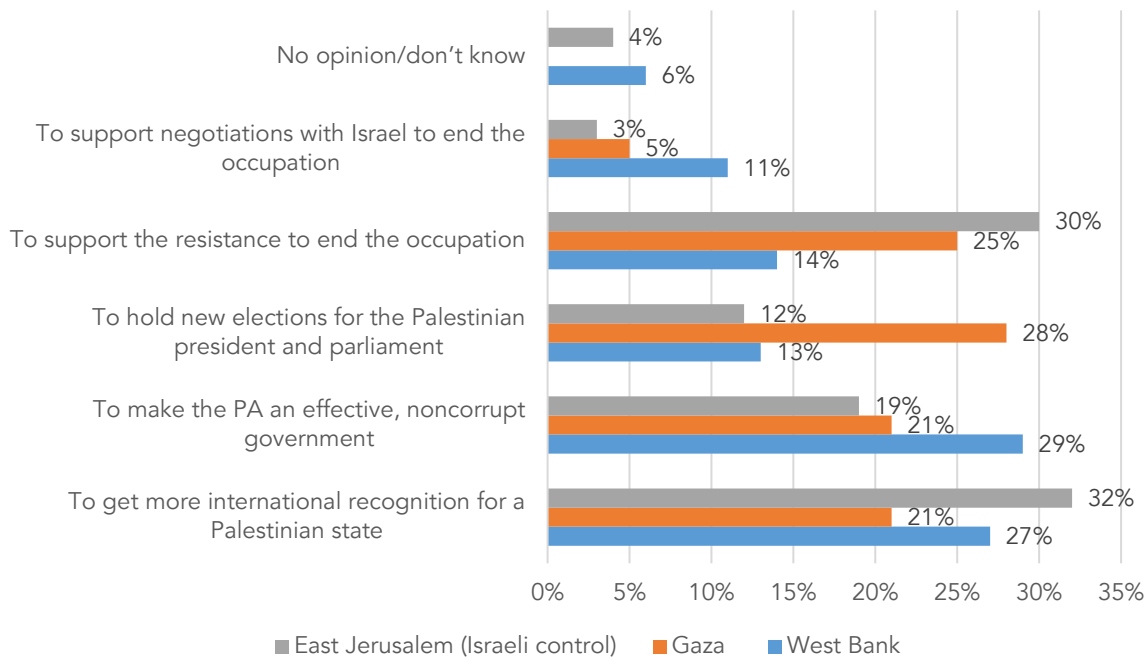

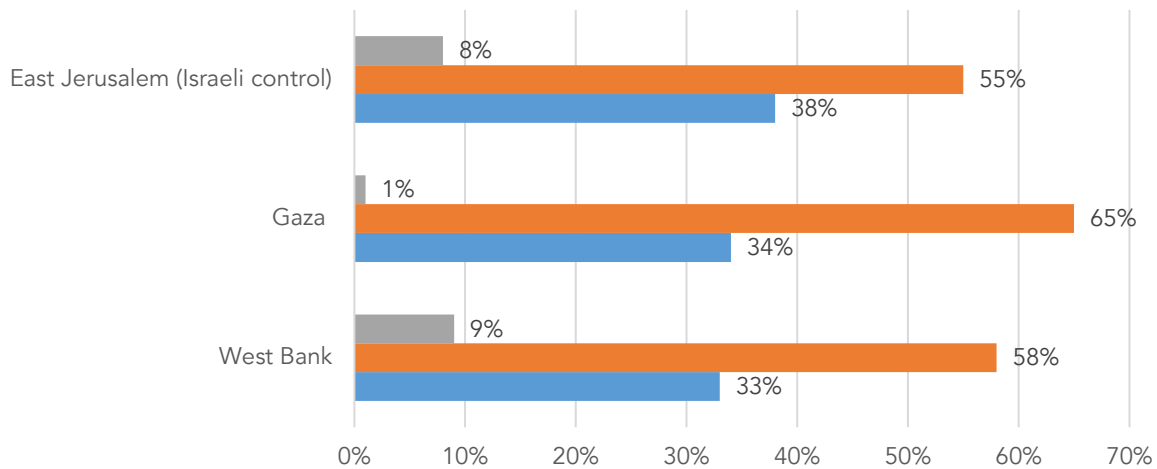

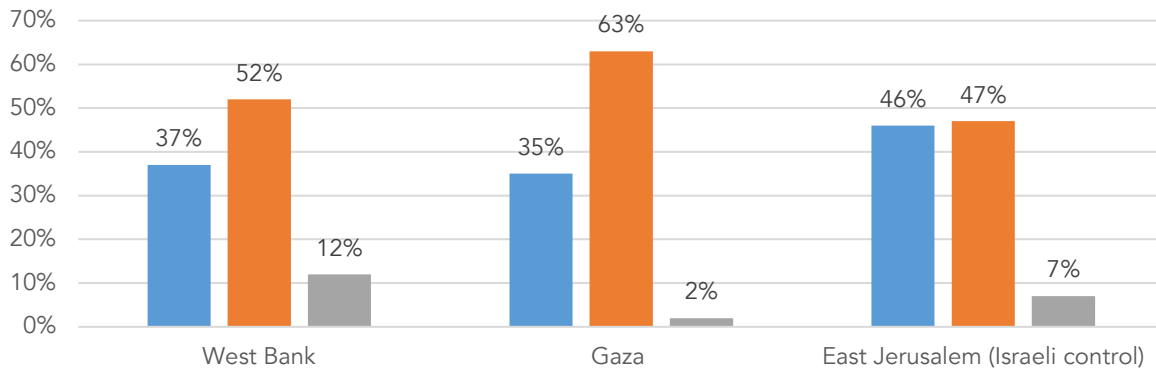

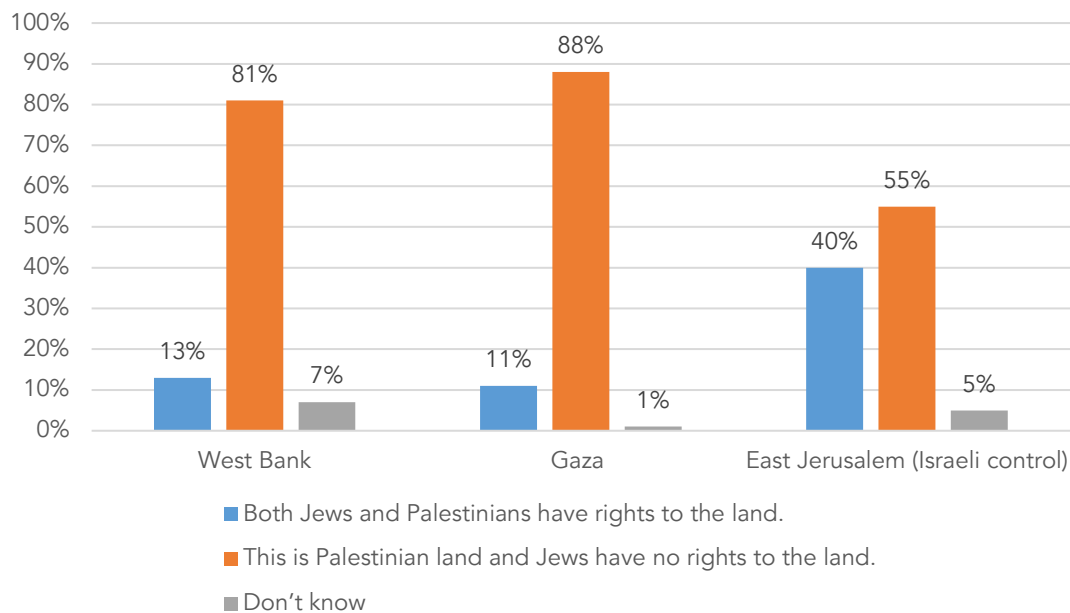

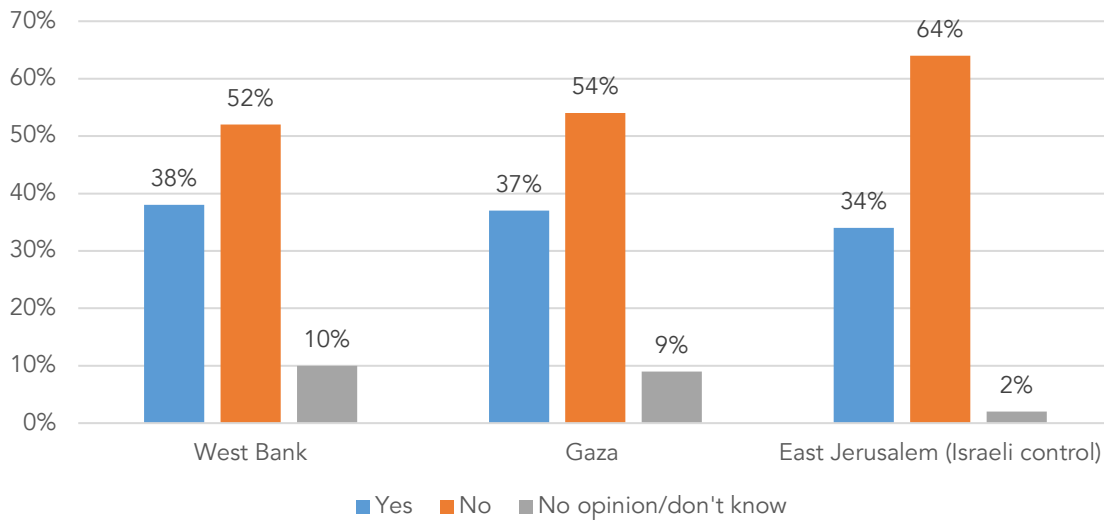

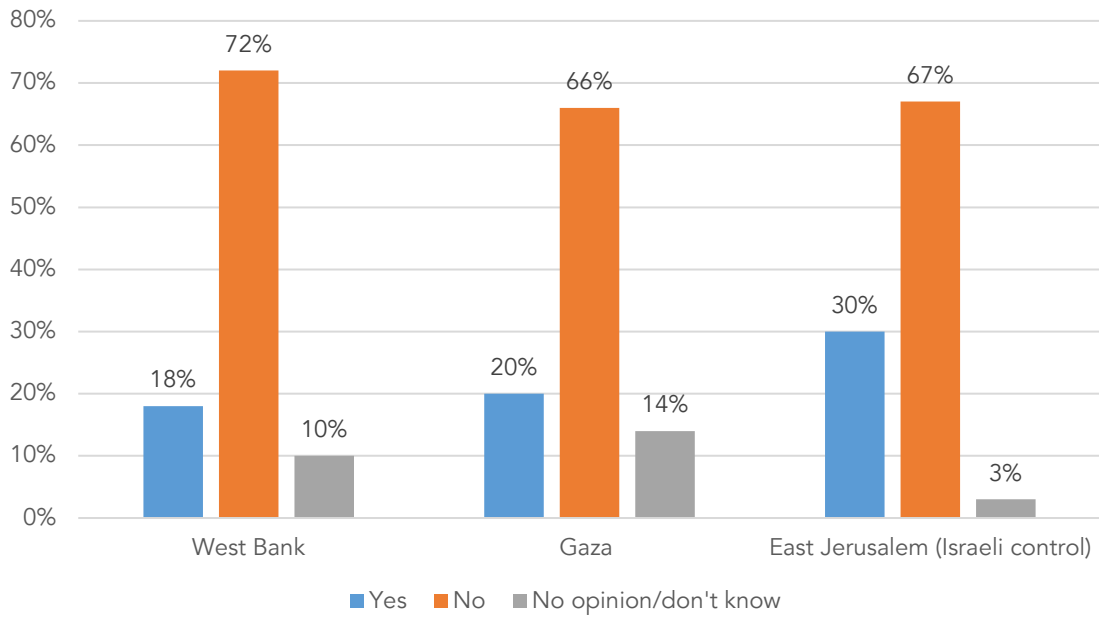

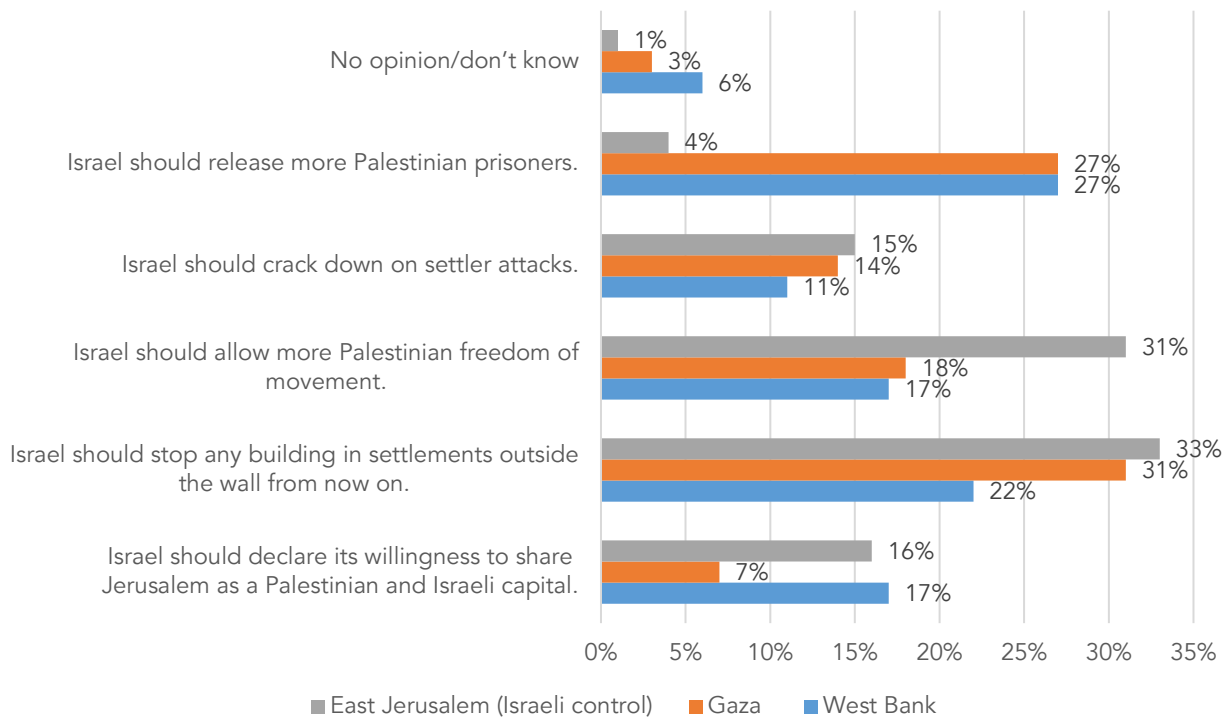

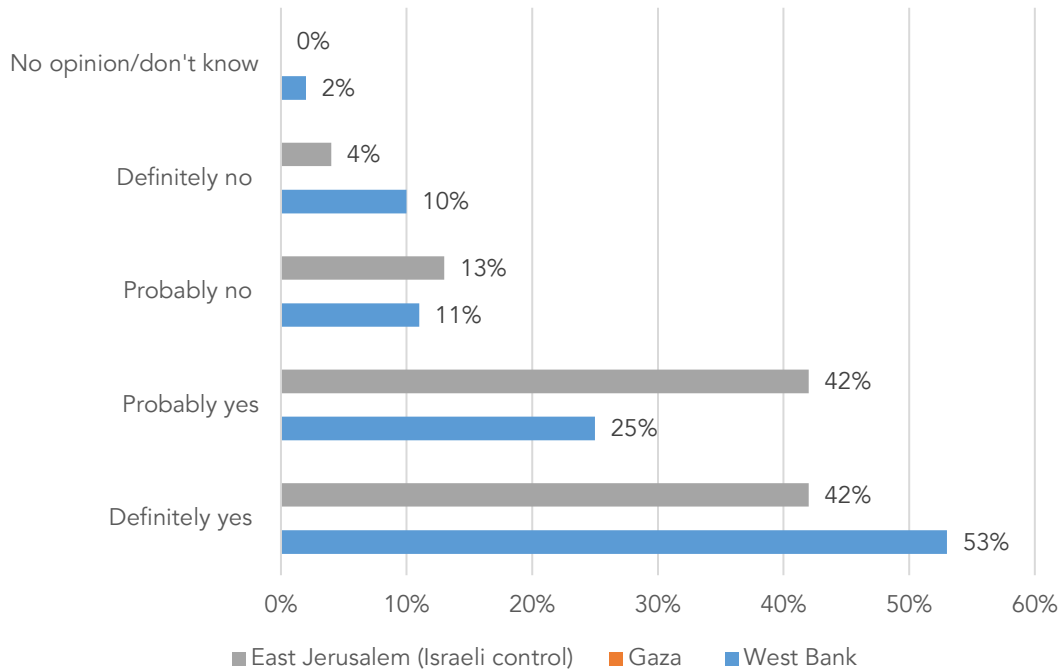

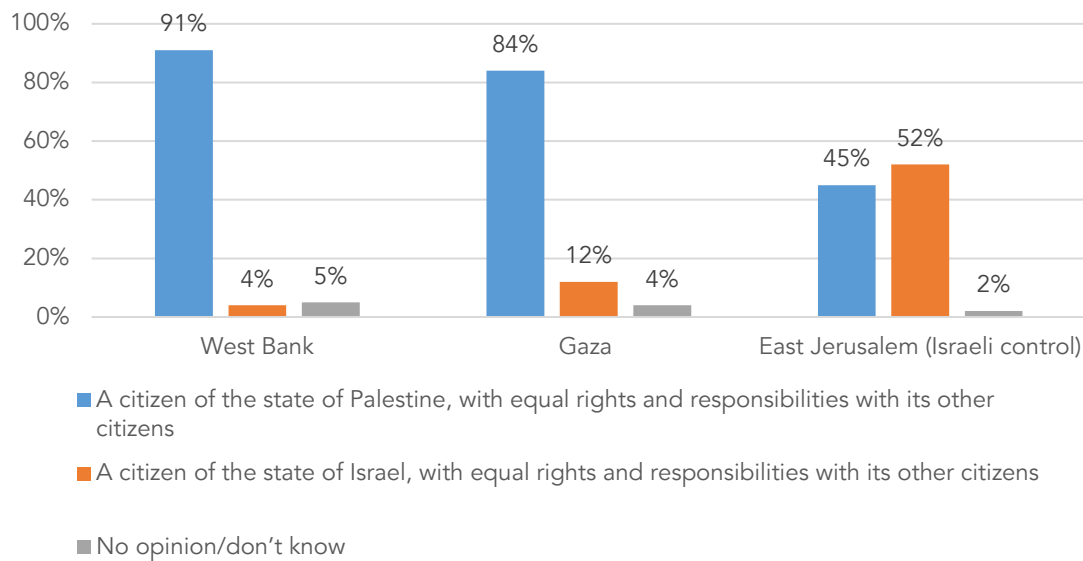

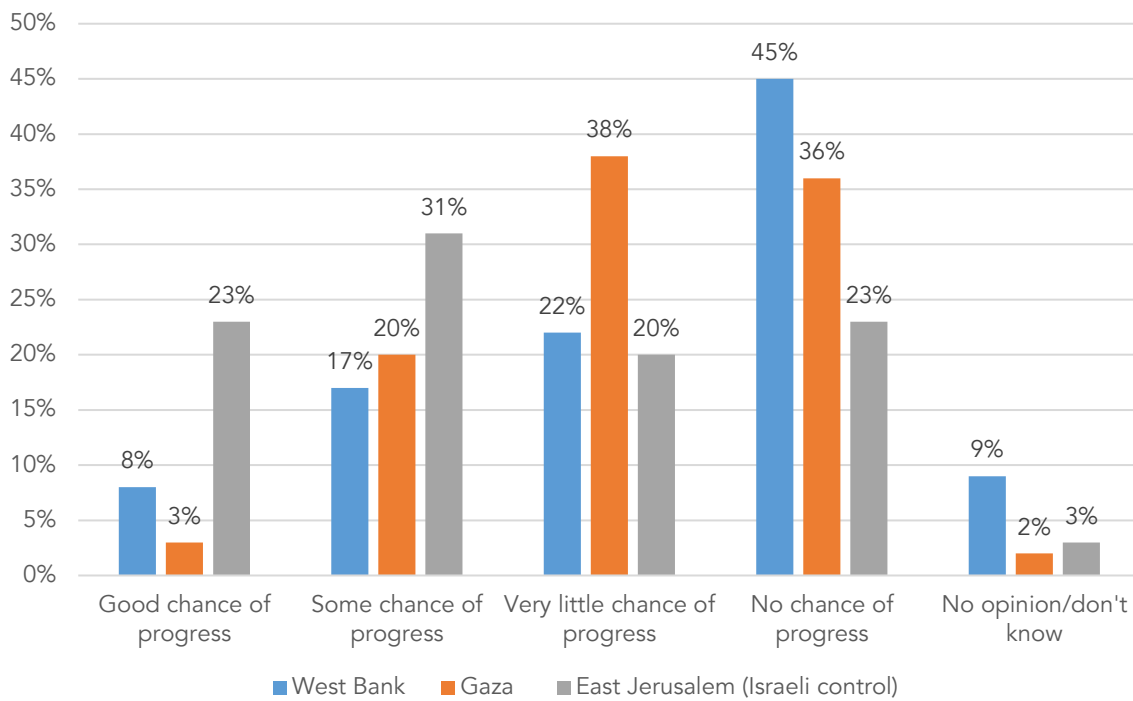

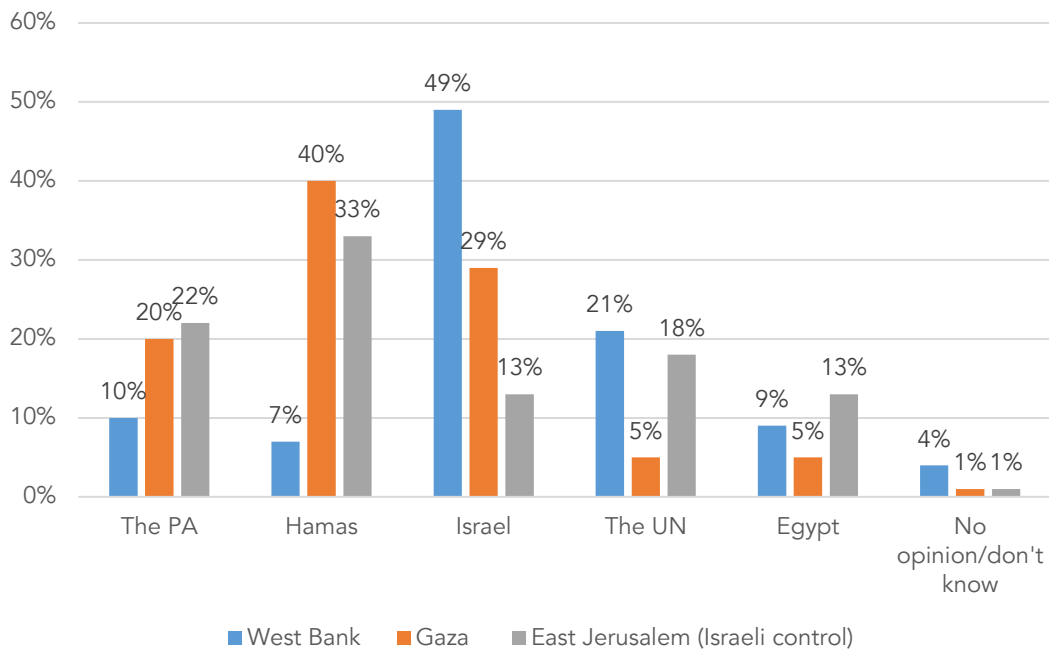

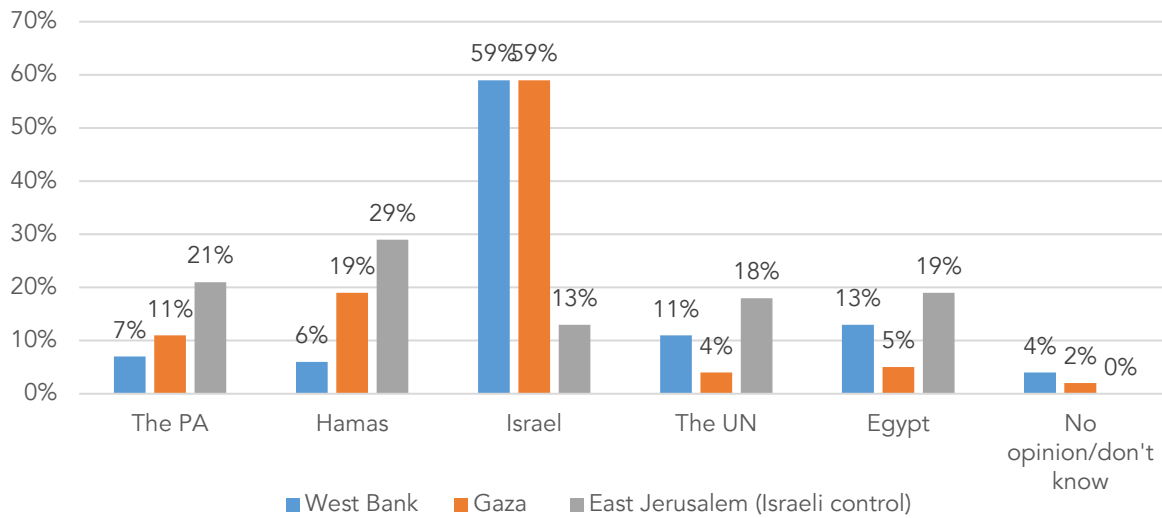

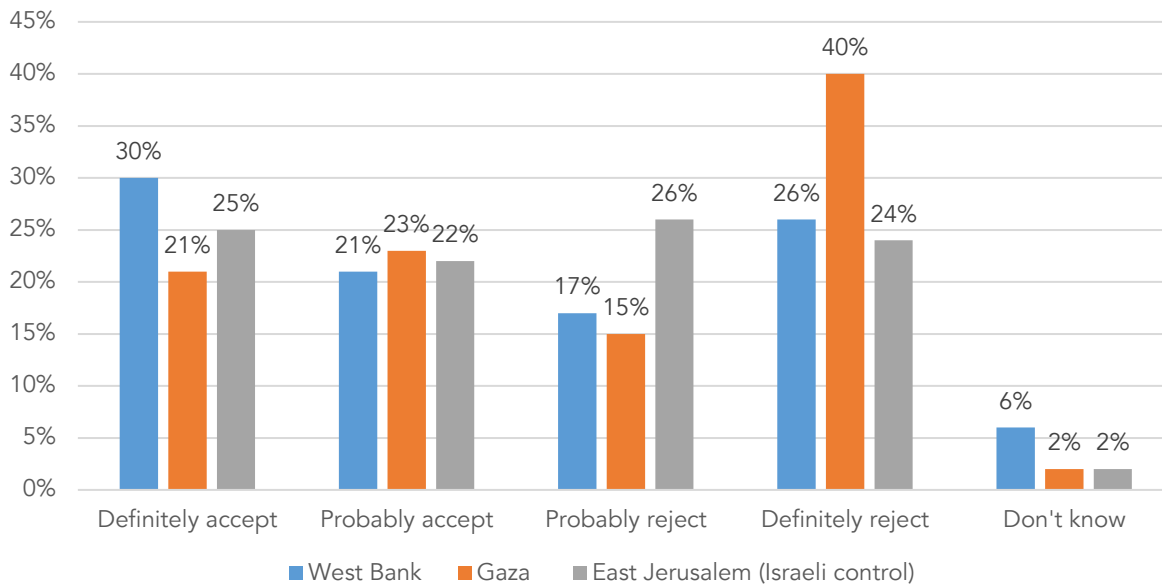

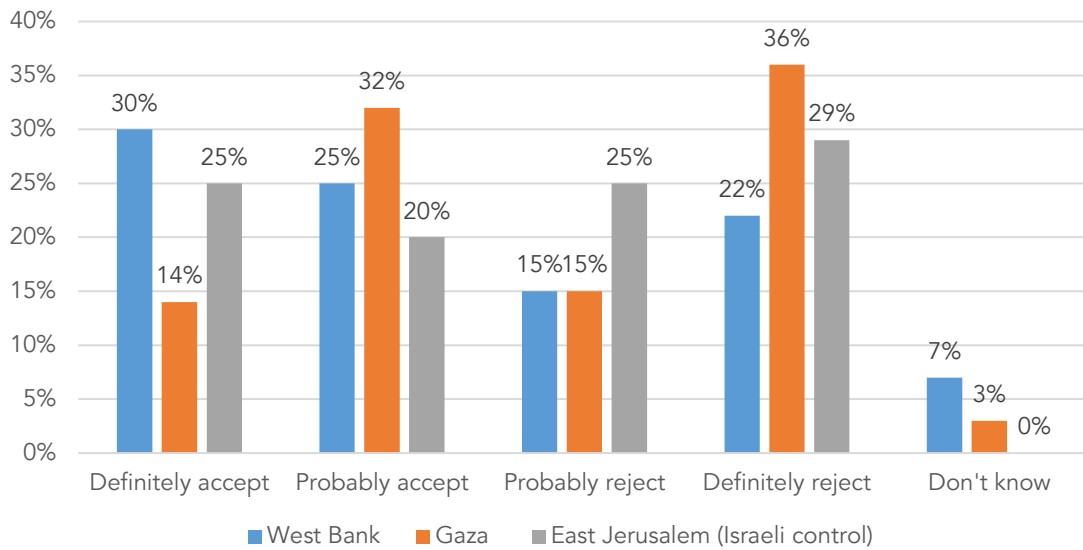

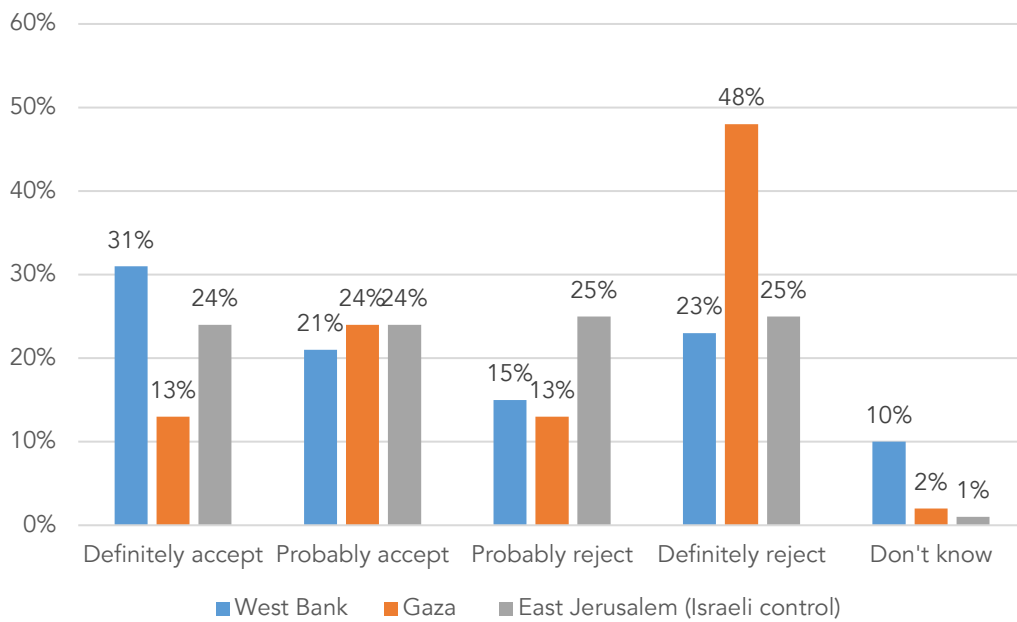

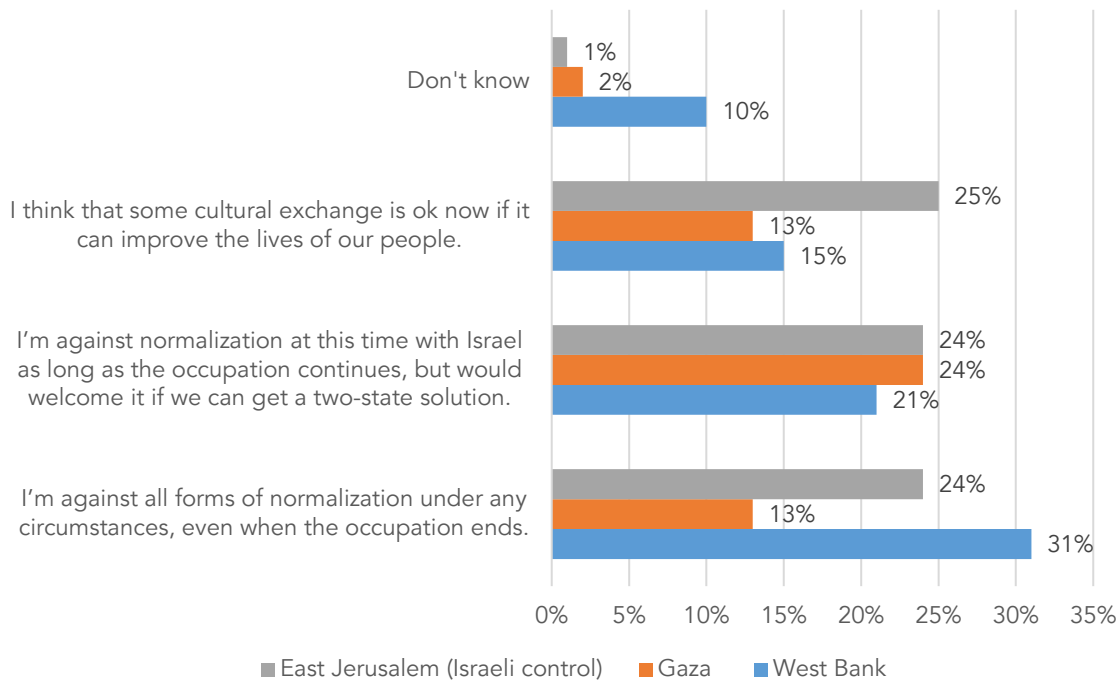

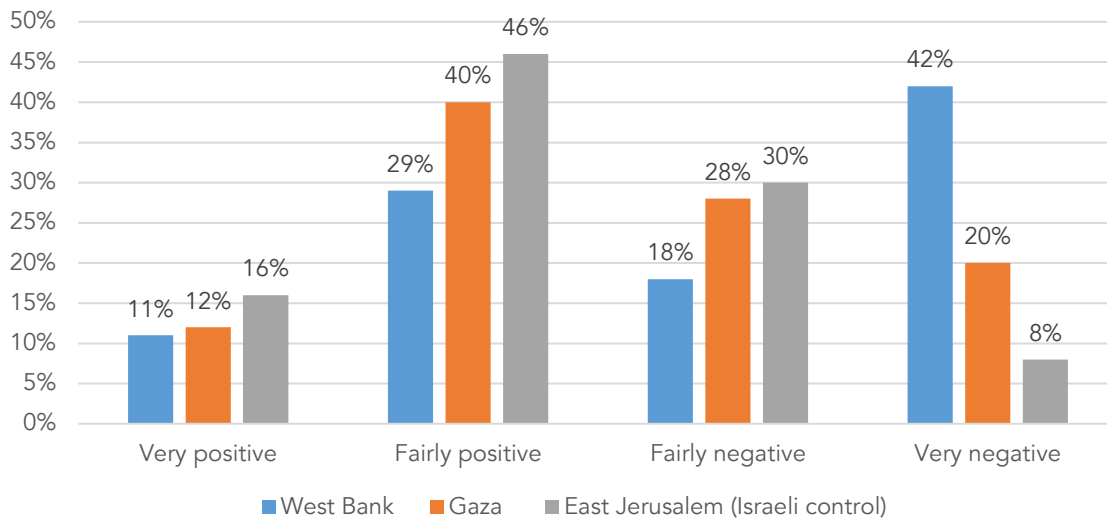

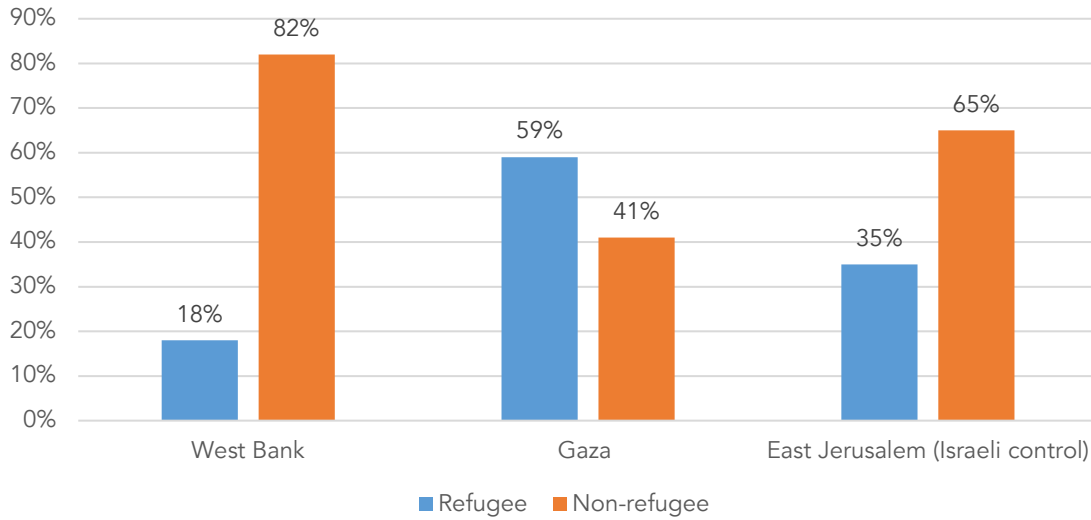

**Refugee status**

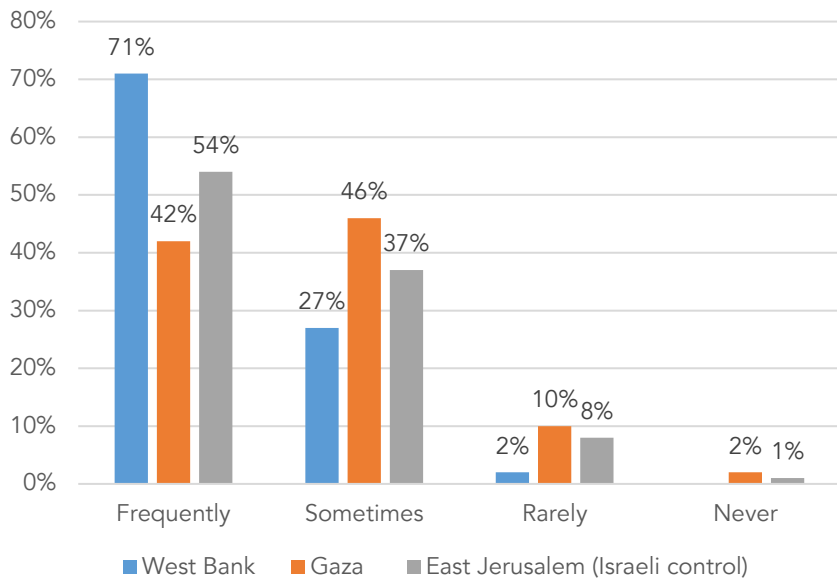

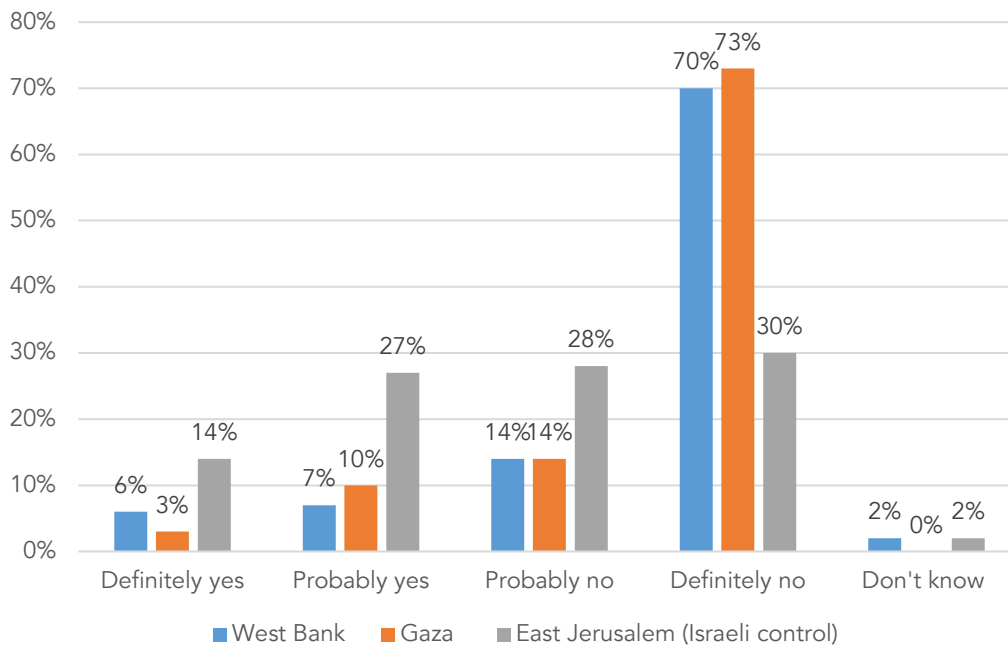
