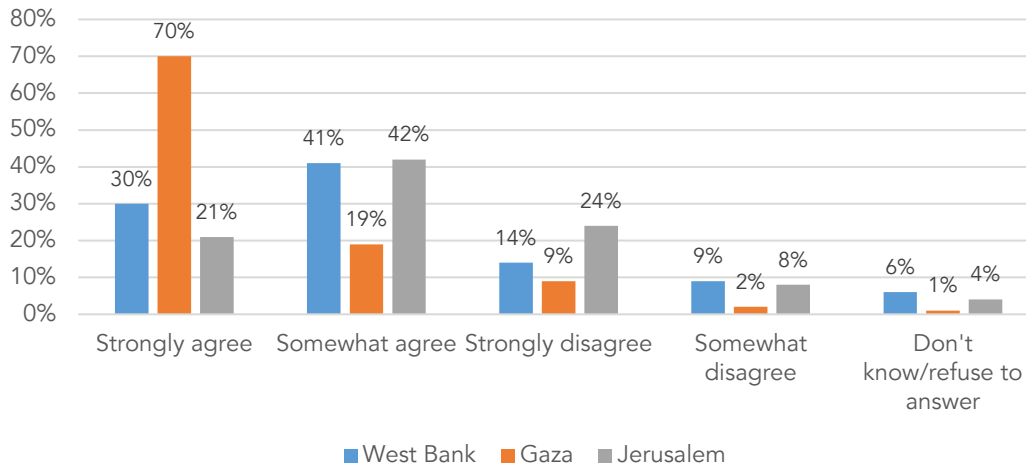

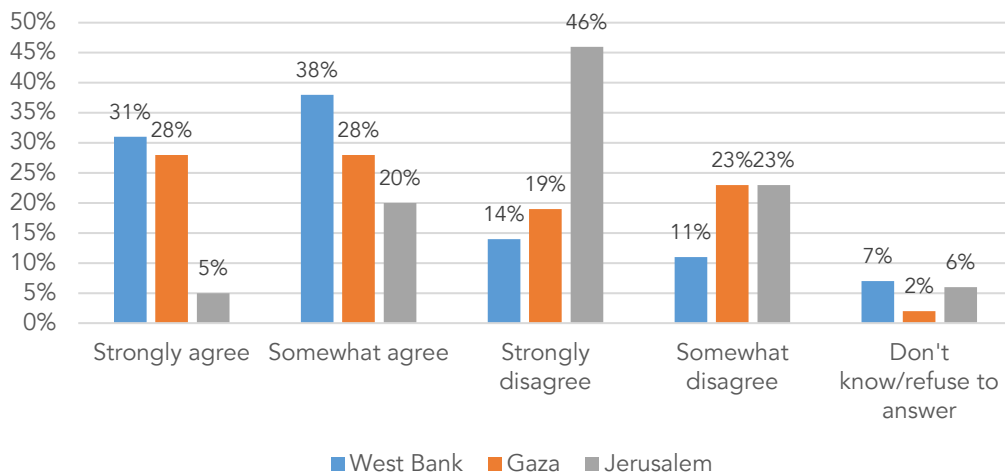

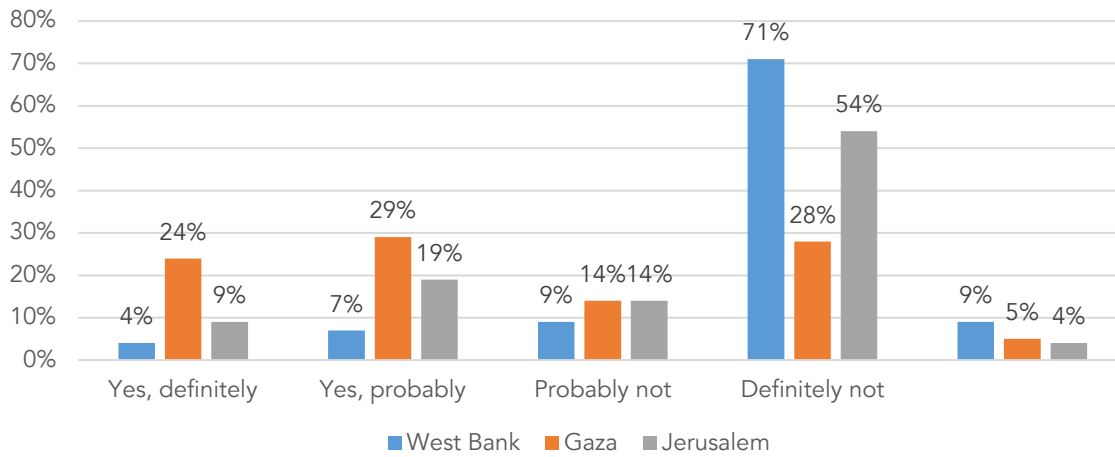

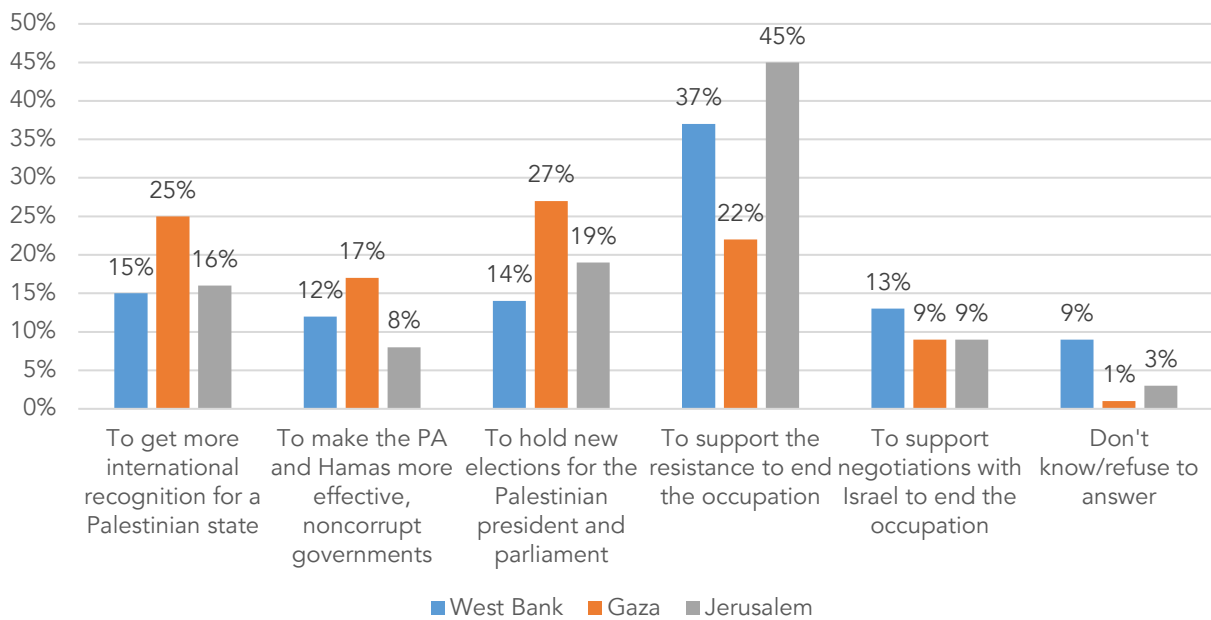

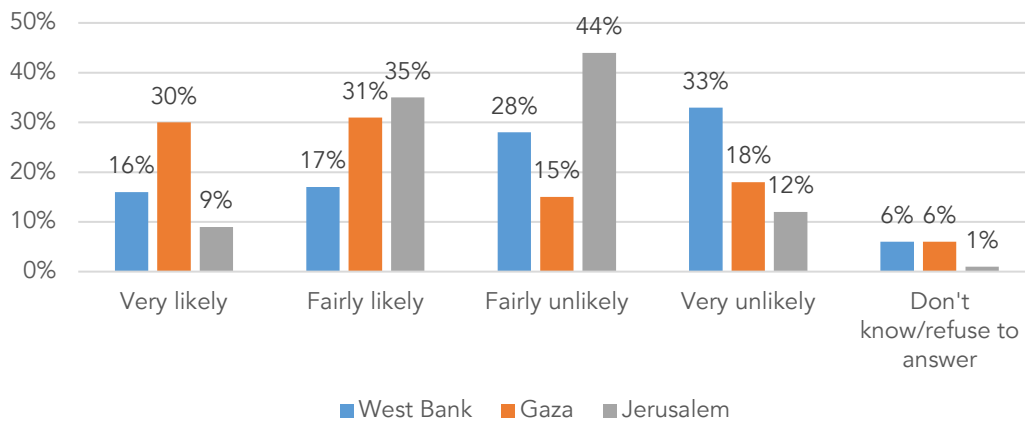

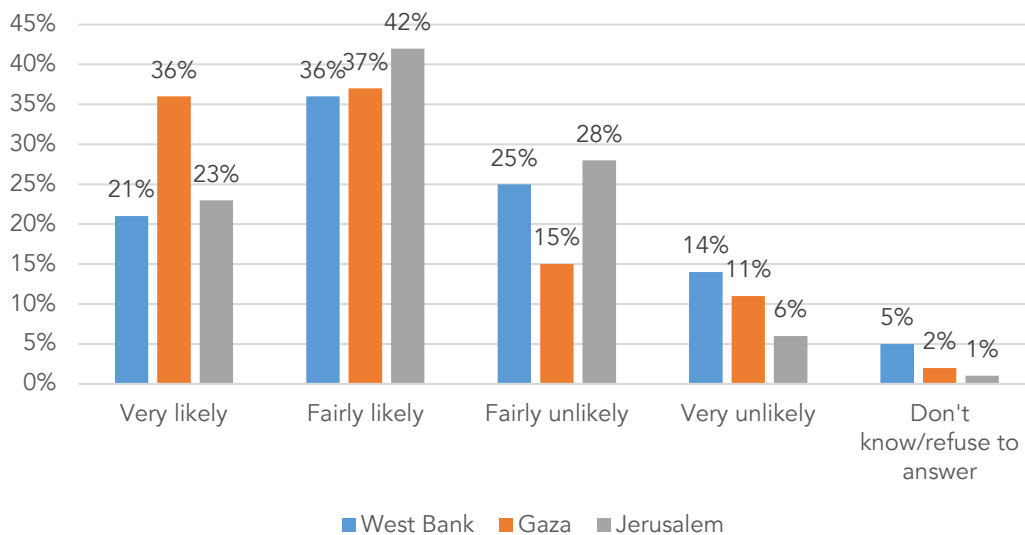

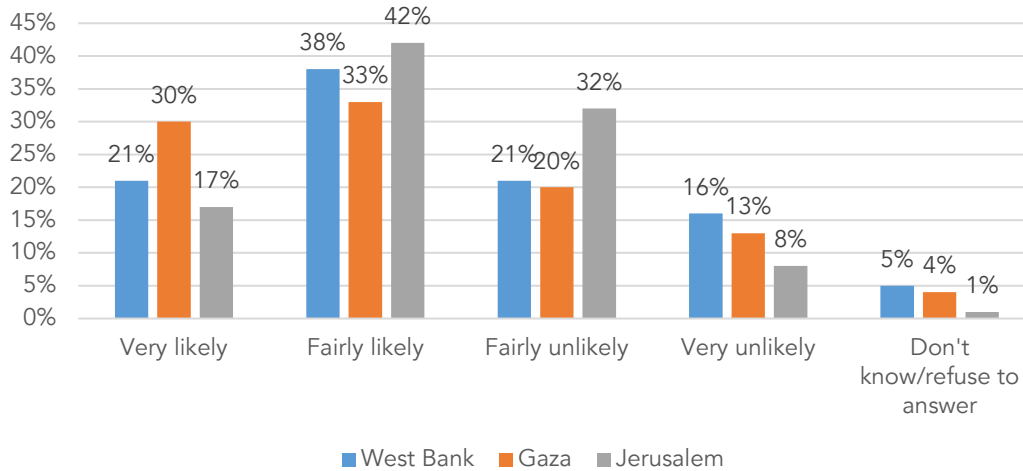
b. A Palestinian national election

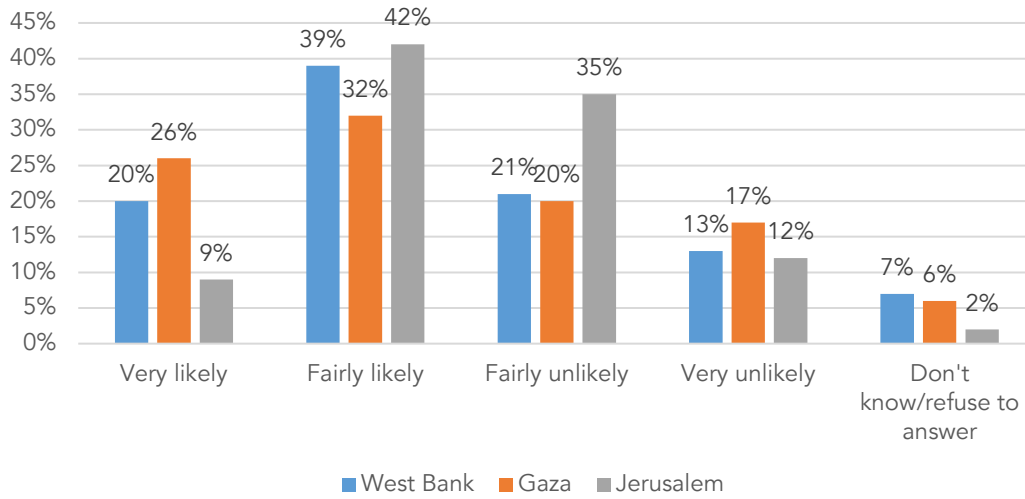

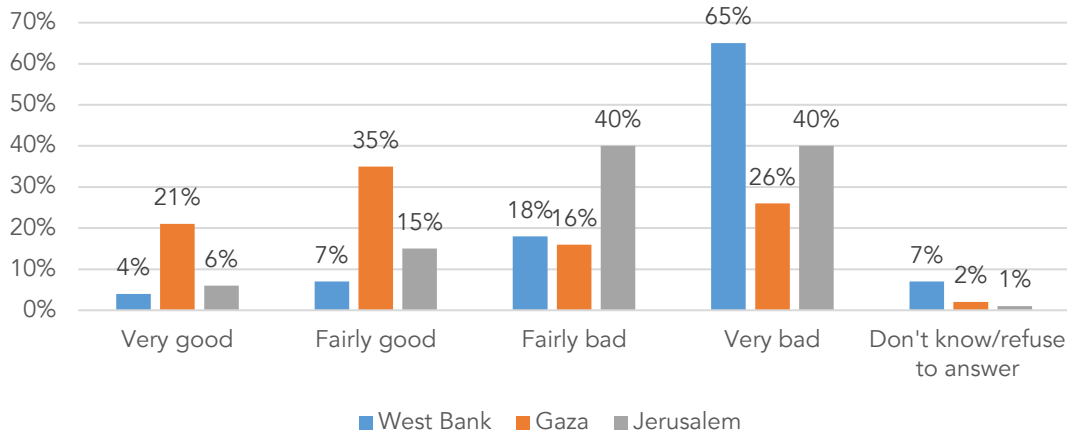

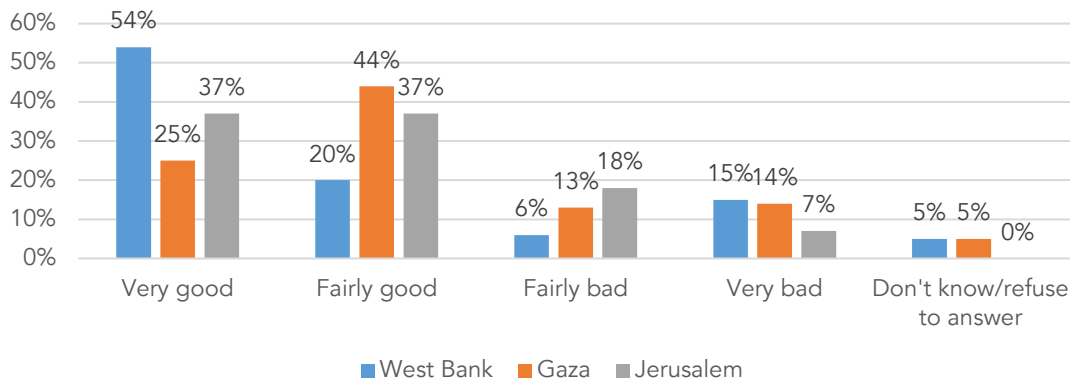
Respondents' views on the recent policies of Egypt's President Sisi

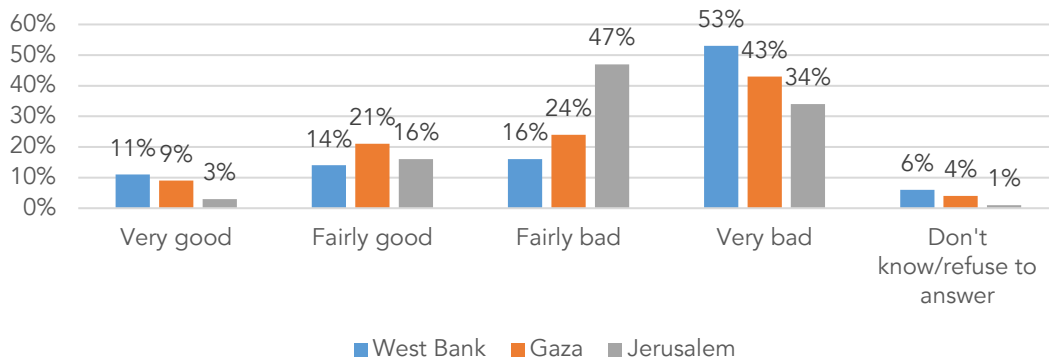
Respondents' Views on the Recent Policies of Jordan's King Abdullah

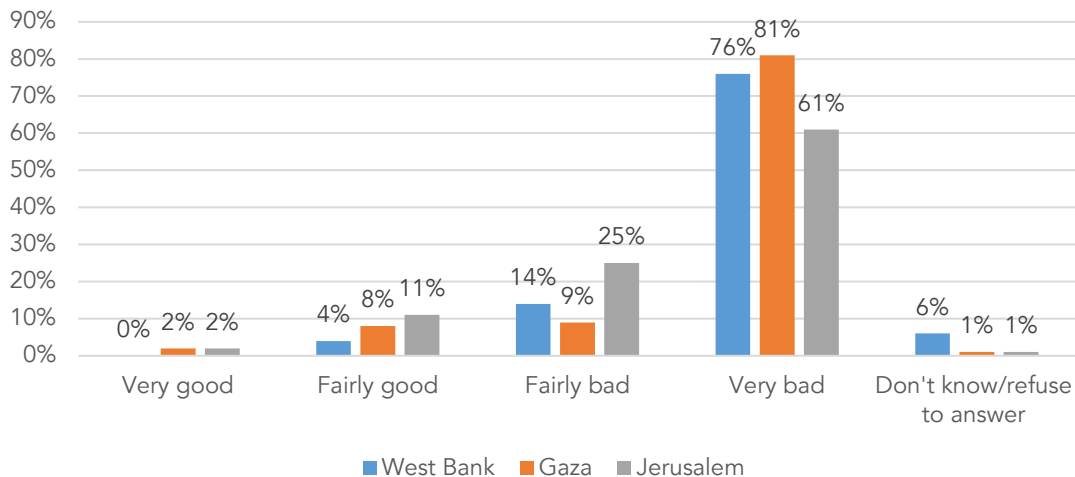
Respondents' views on the recent policies of Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince Muhammad bin Salman

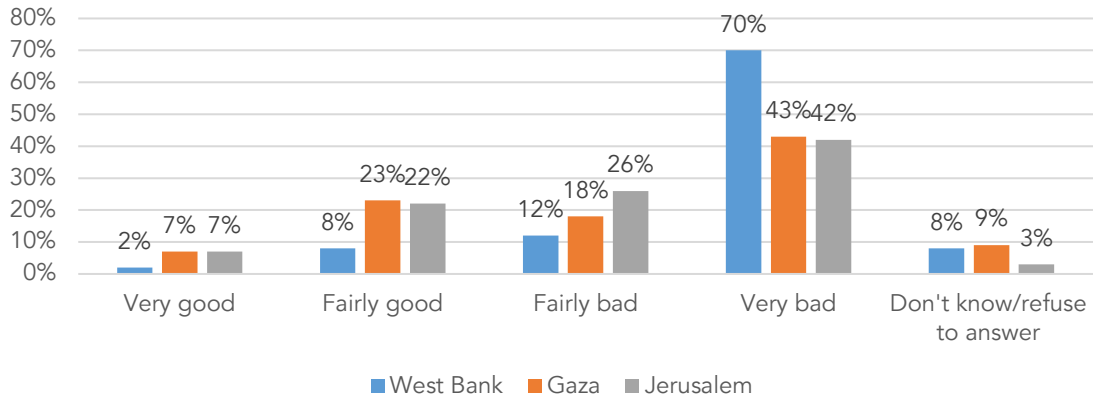

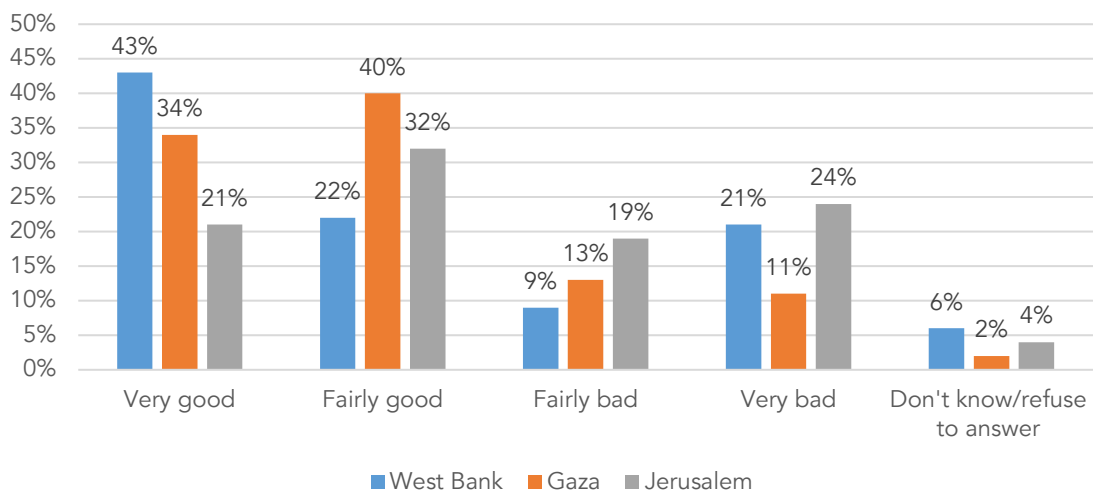

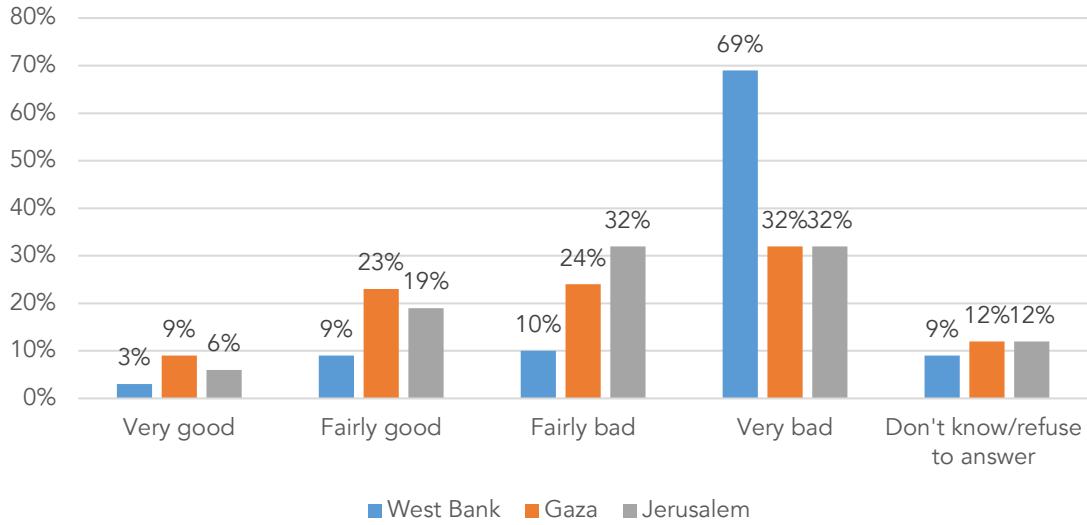

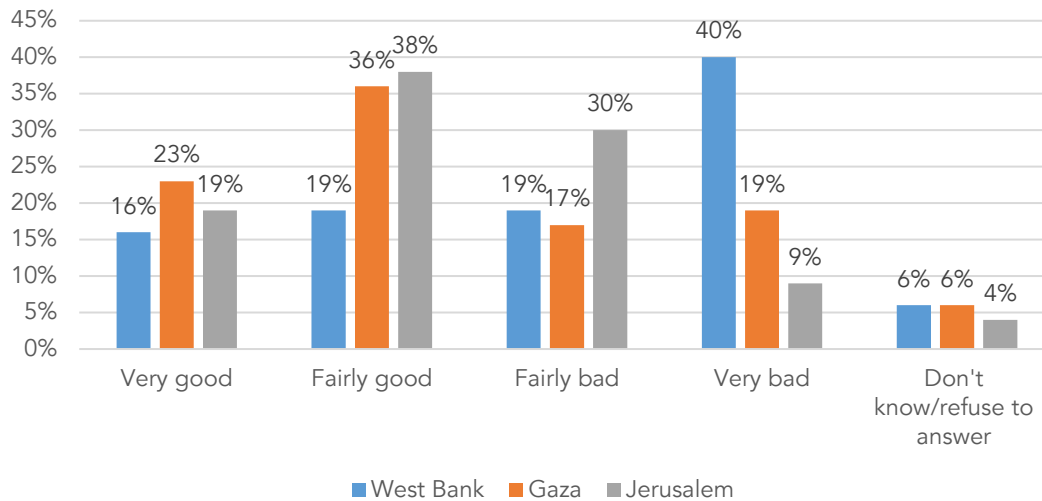

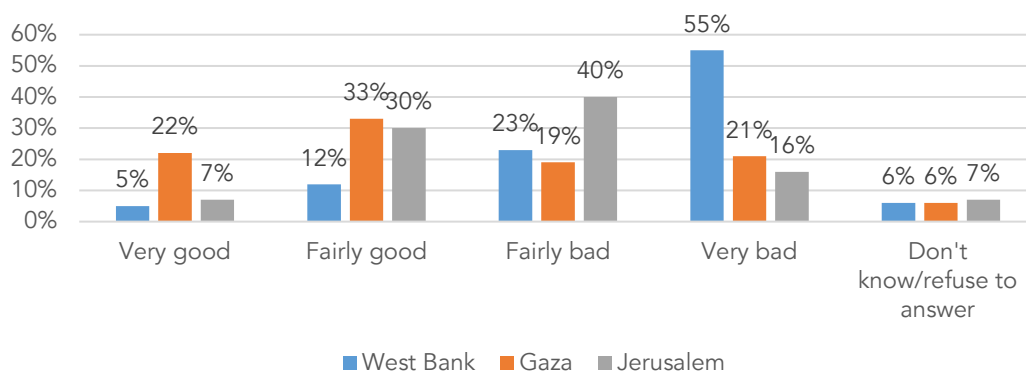
Respondents' views on the recent policies of Hezbollah

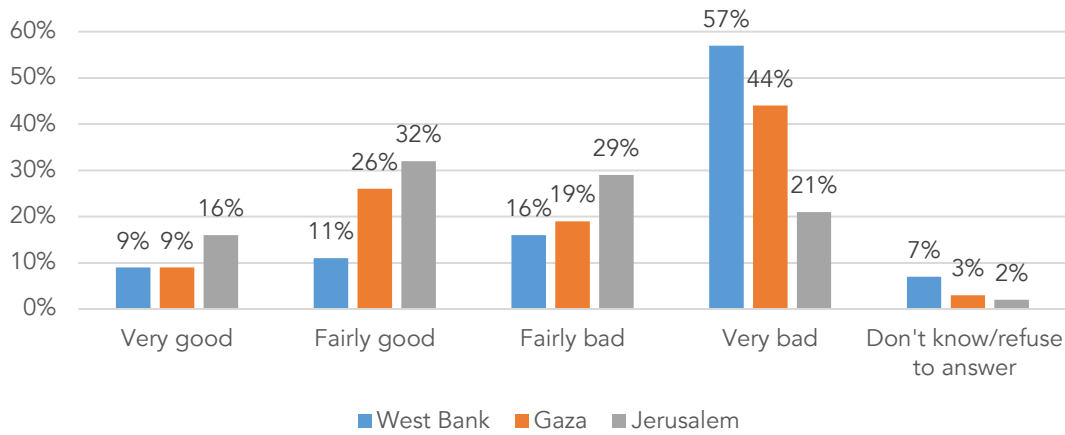
Respondents' views on the recent policies of the Muslim Brotherhood

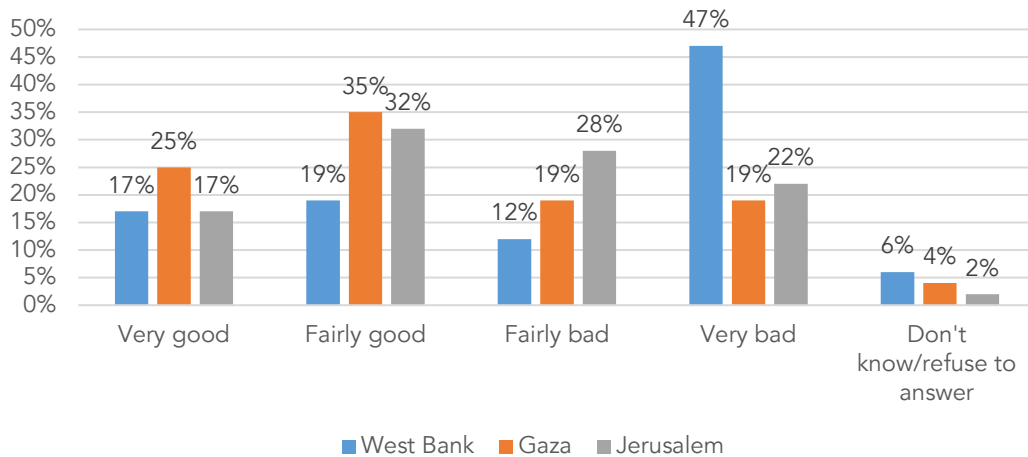

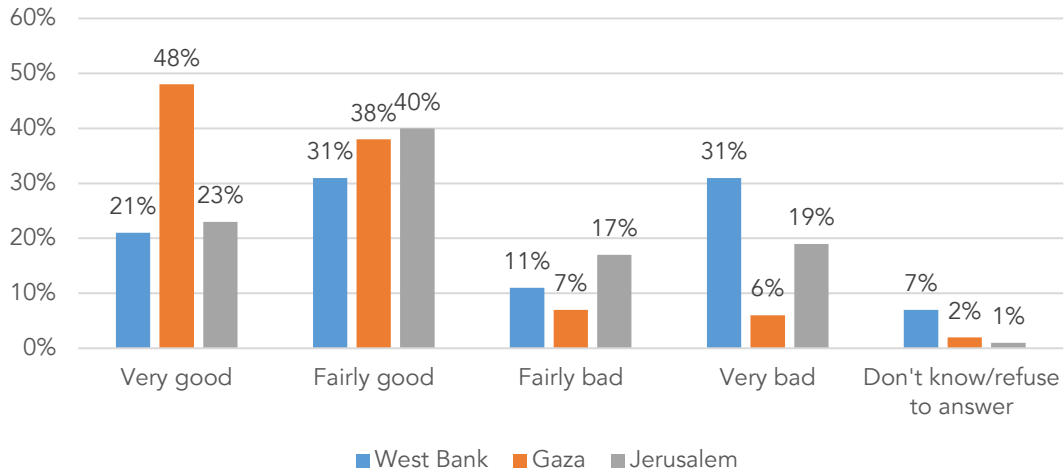

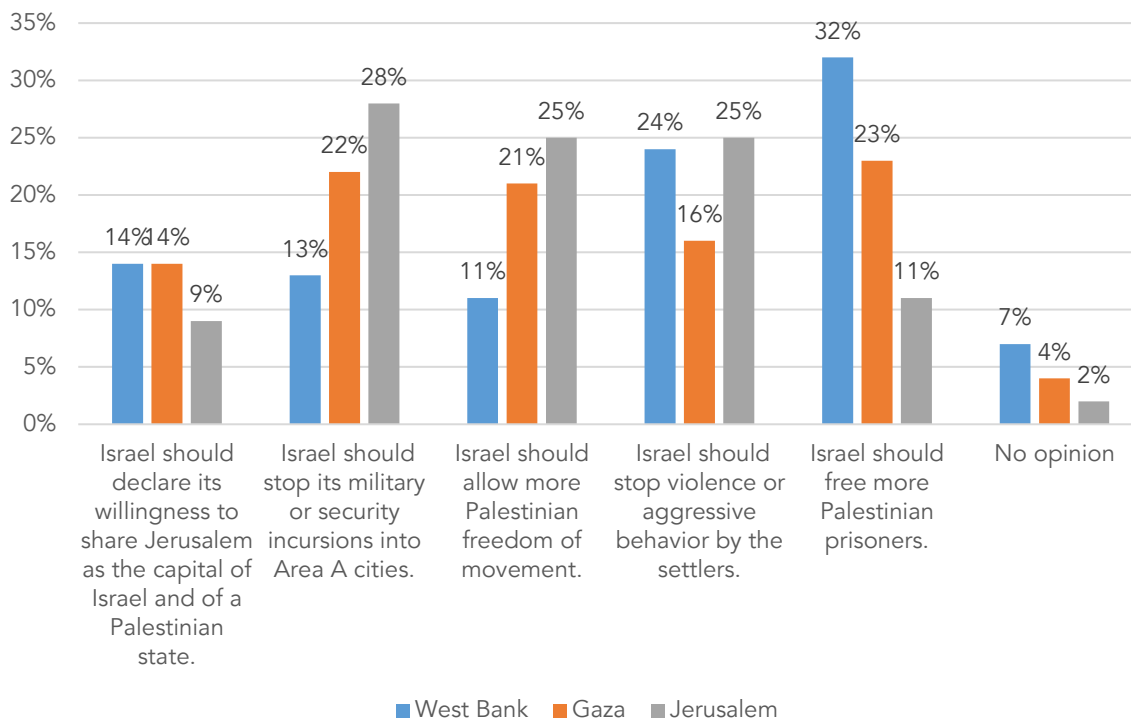

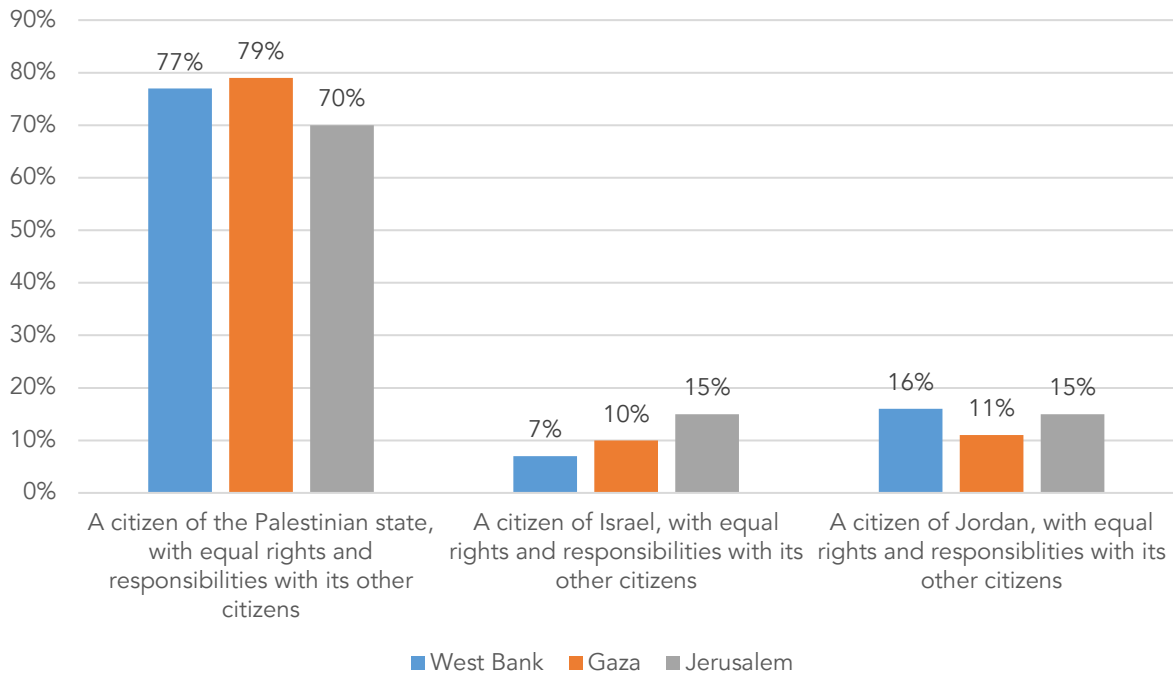

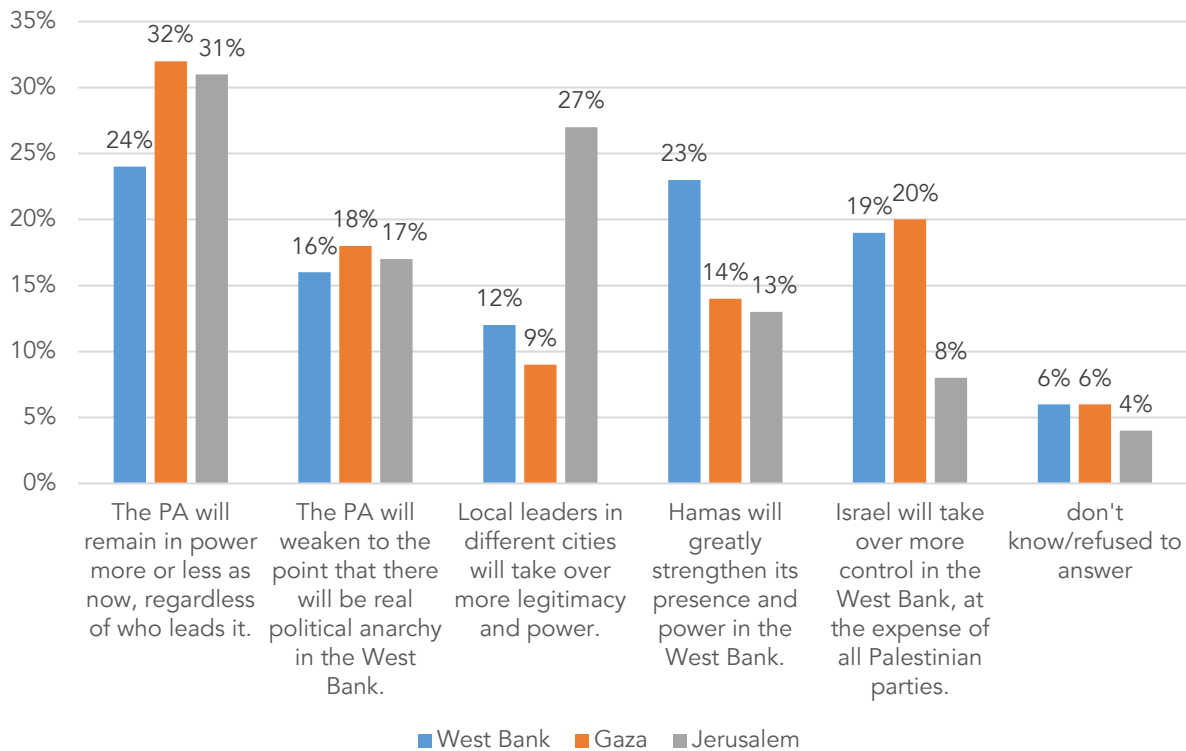

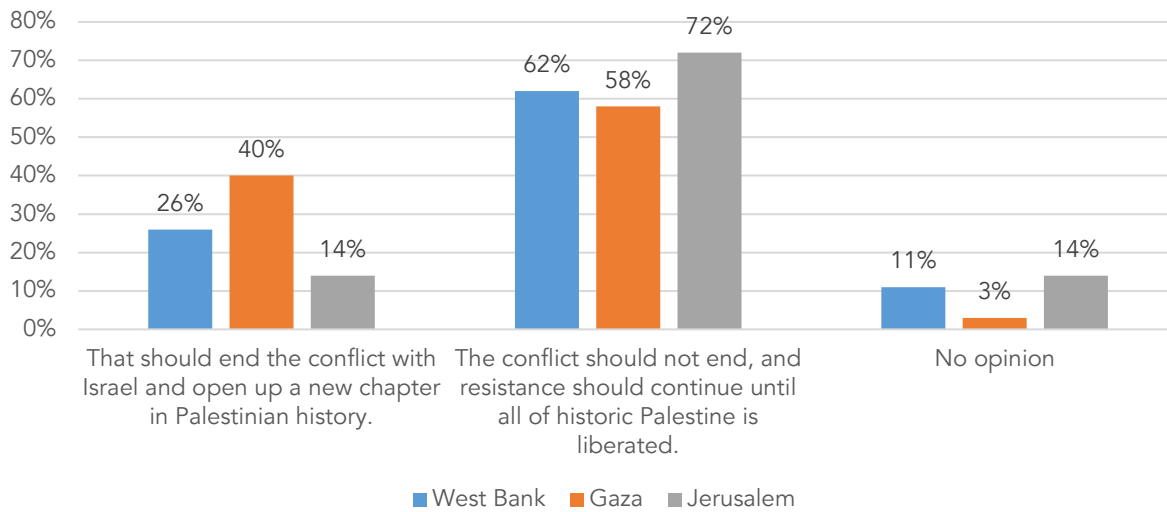

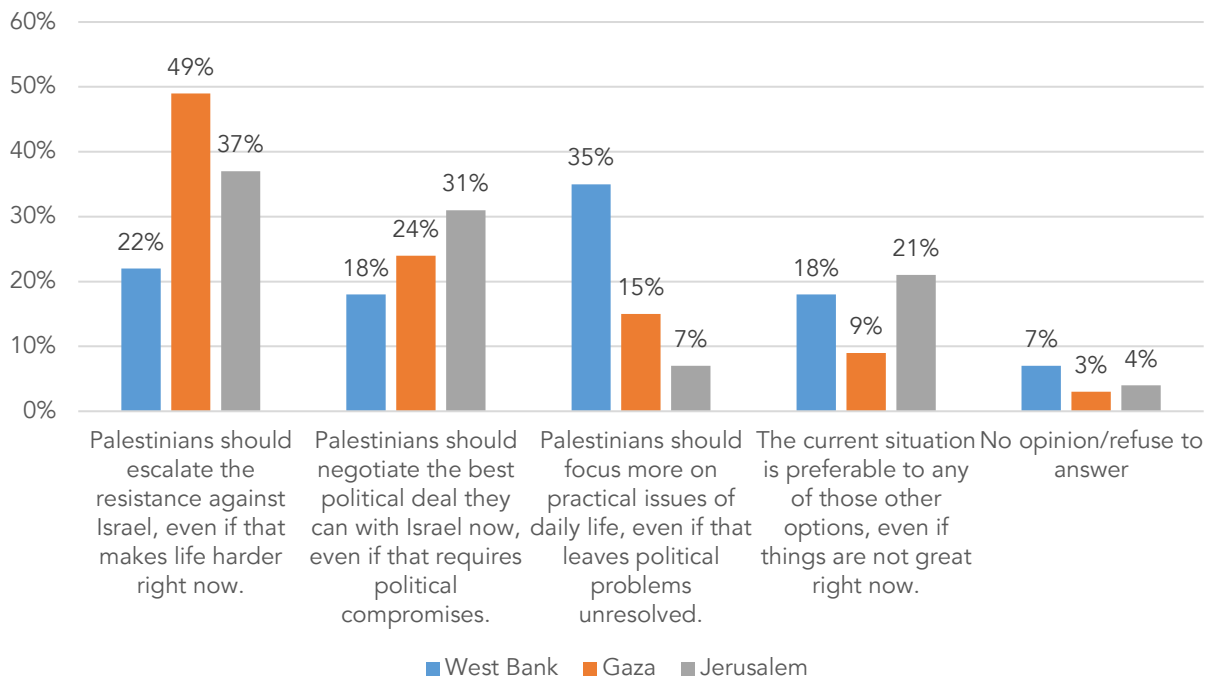

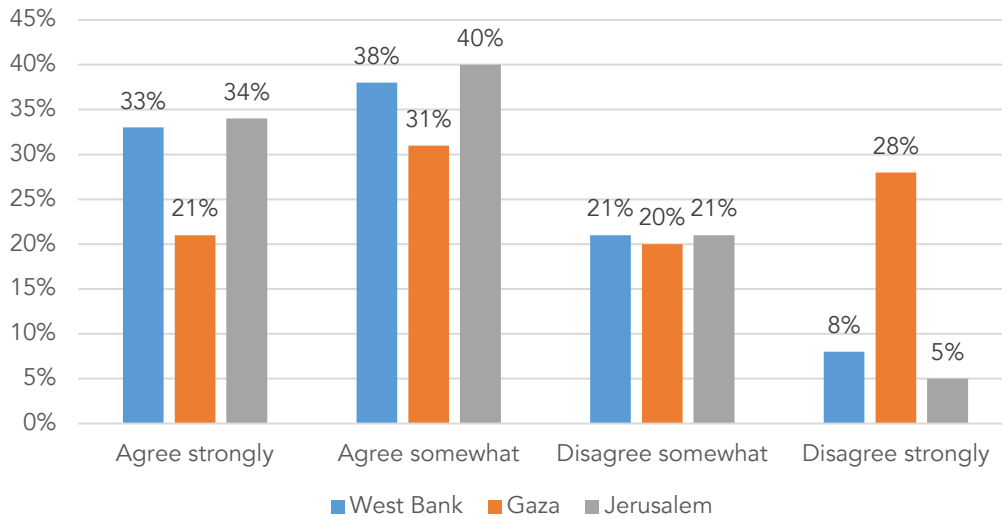

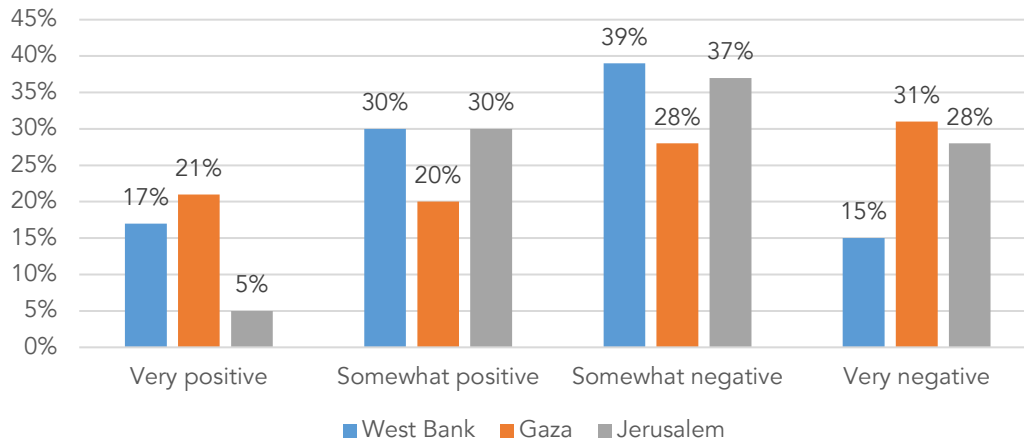

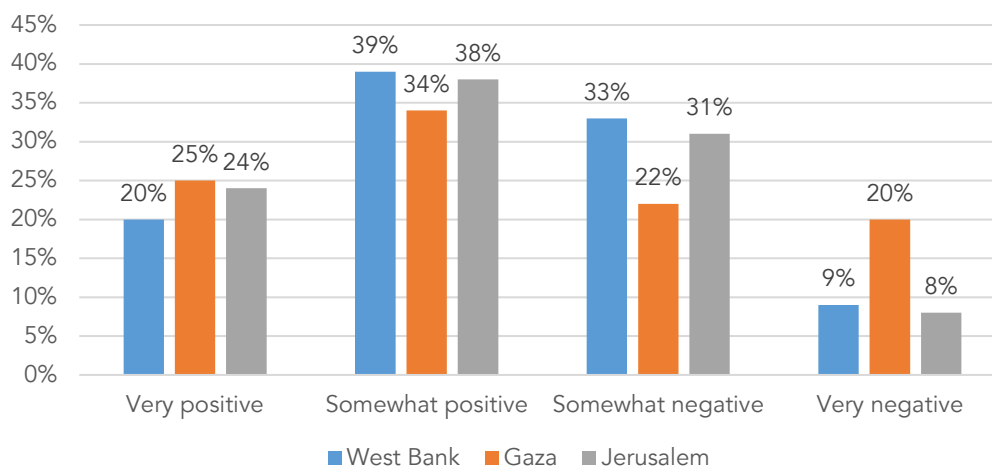
Views on the killing of Iranian Gen. Qasem Soleimani in Baghdad

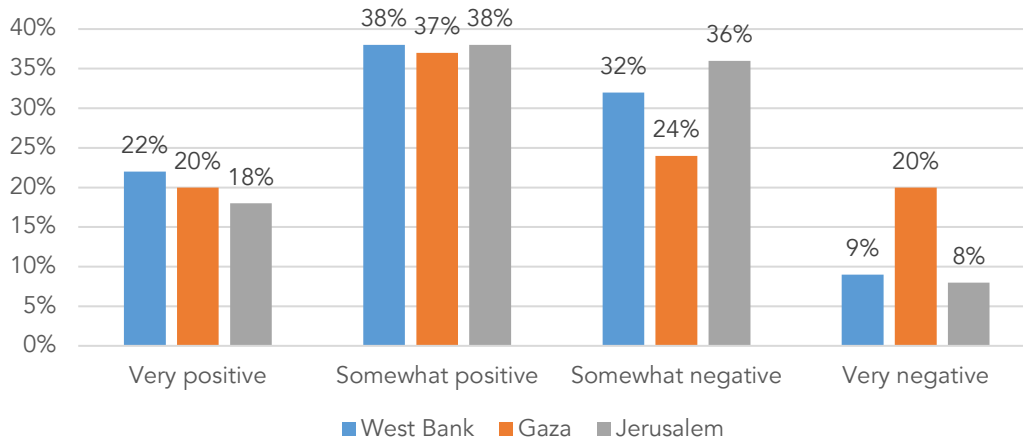
Views on the anti-government street protests in Lebanon

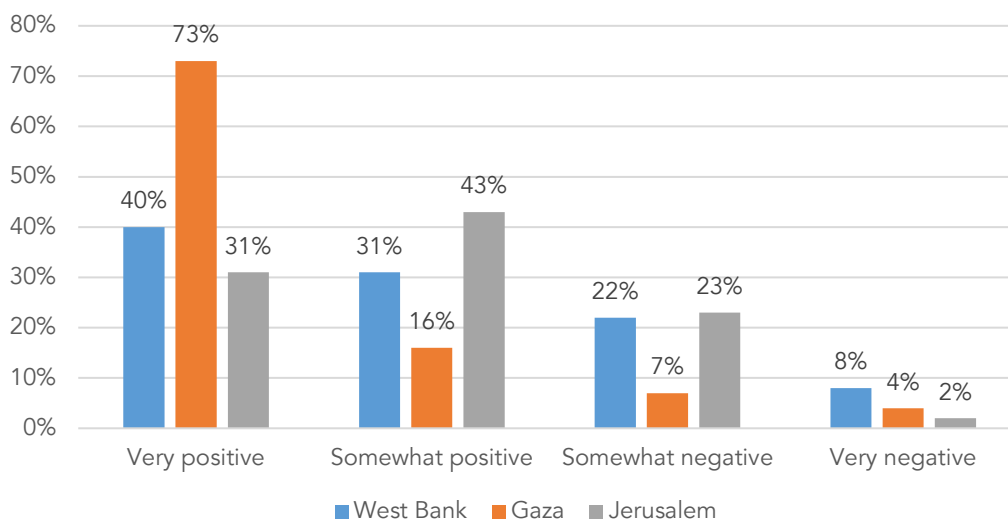
Views on the Turkish decision to send some troops to Libya

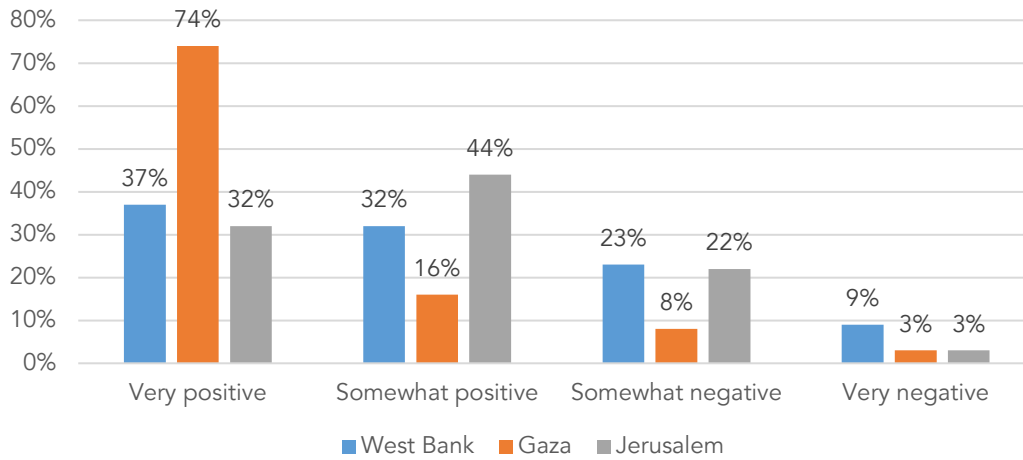
Views on the impeachment by the U.S. Congress of President Trump

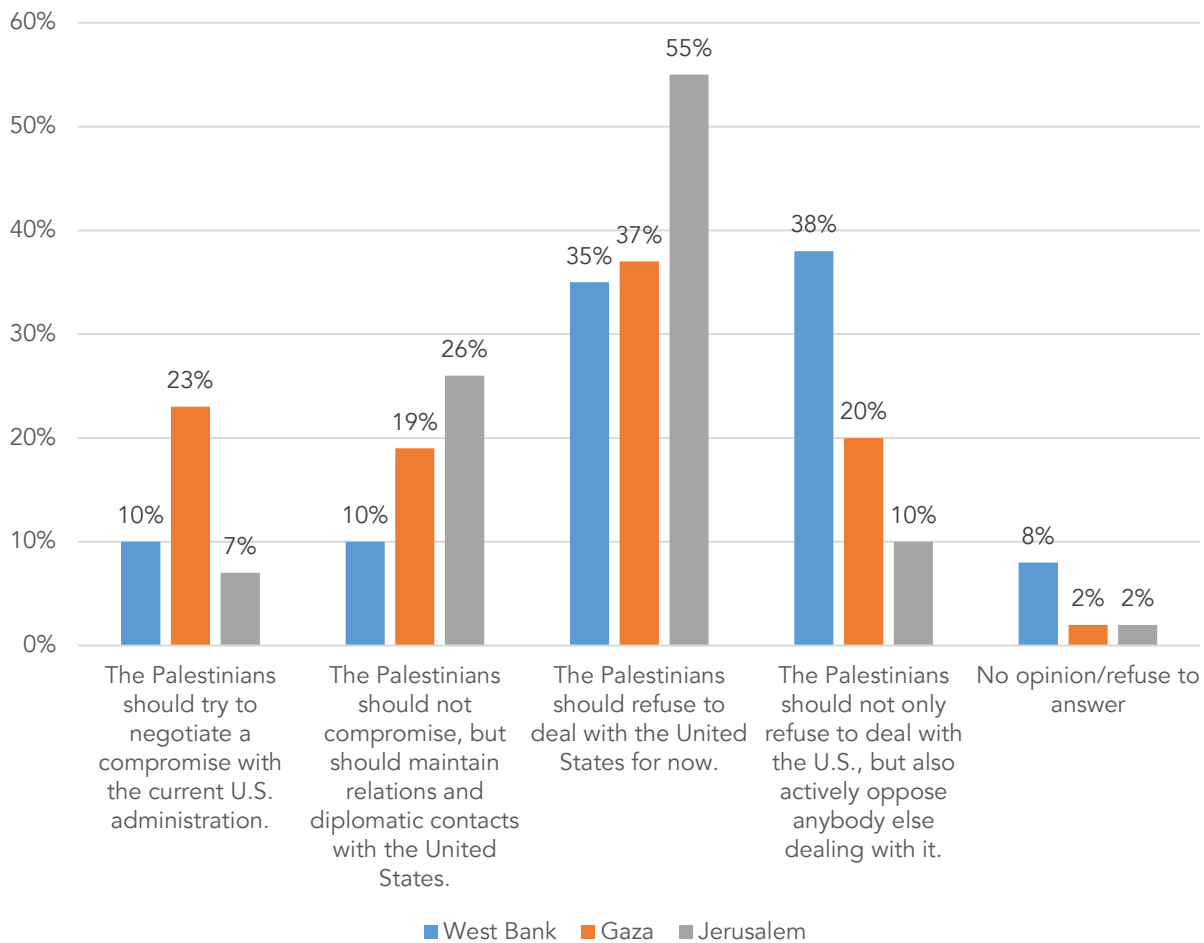

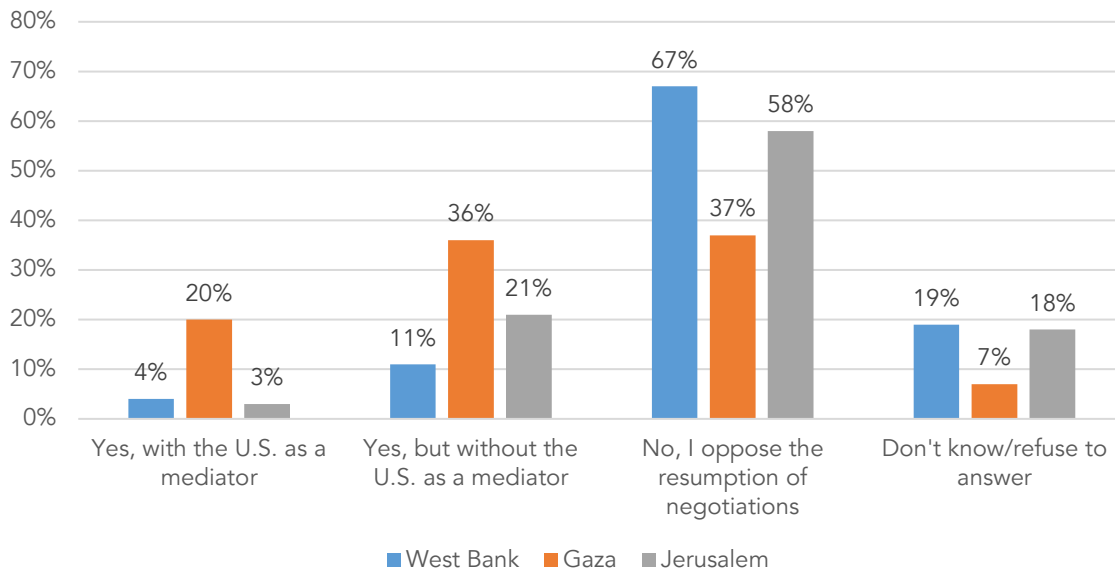

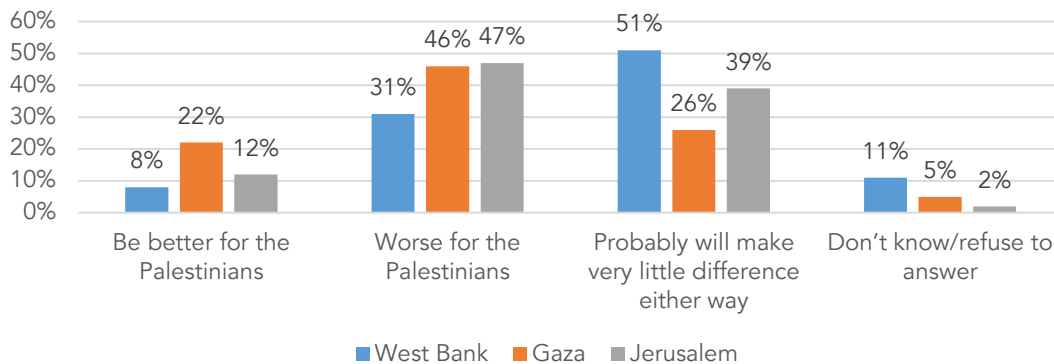

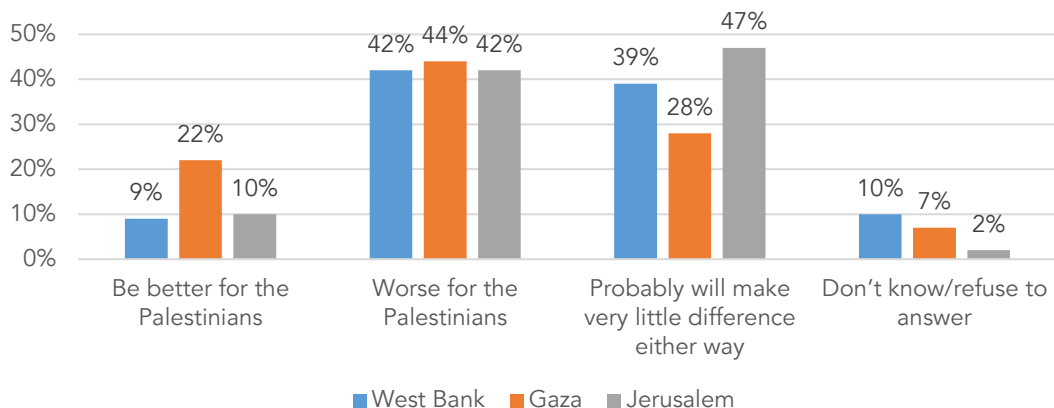
Views on how Israel's national election in March will affect Palestinians

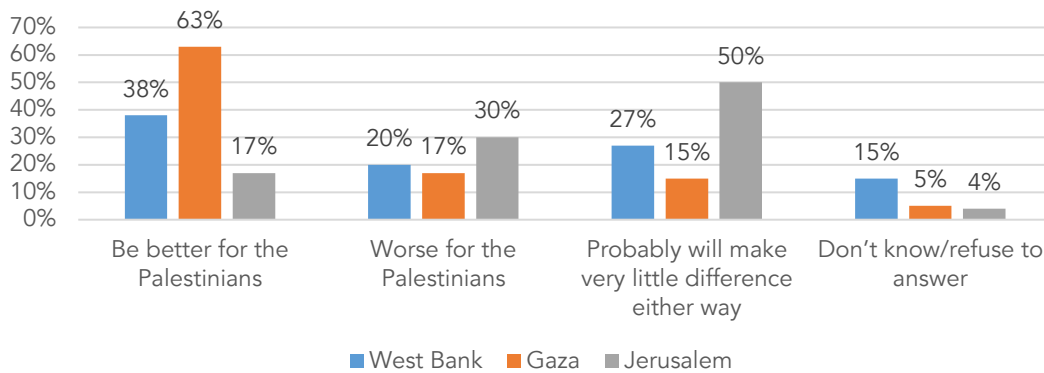
Views on how the U.S. presidential election in November will affect Palestinians

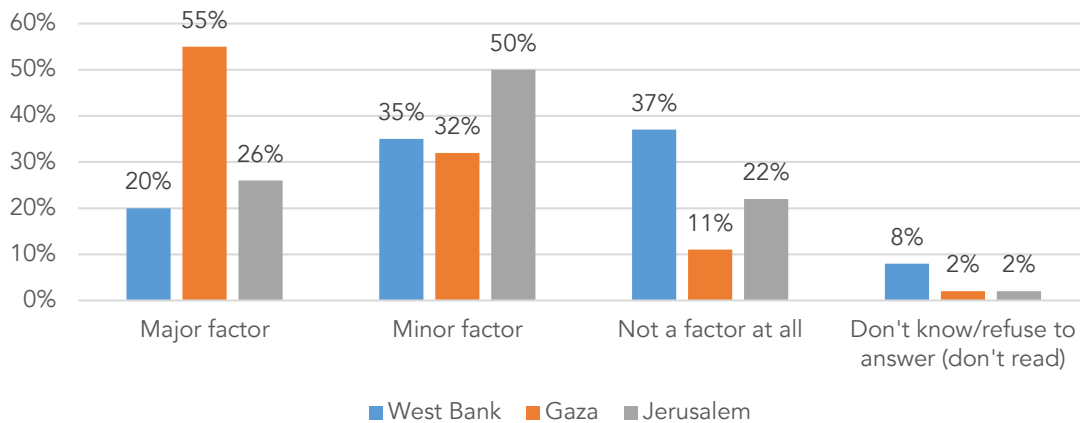
Views on how a Palestinian national election in the West Bank and Gaza would affect Palestinians

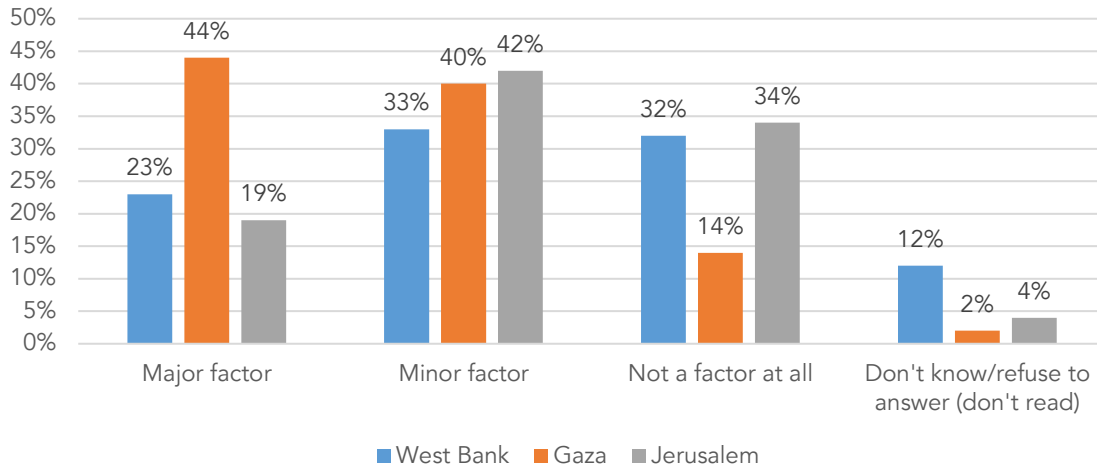

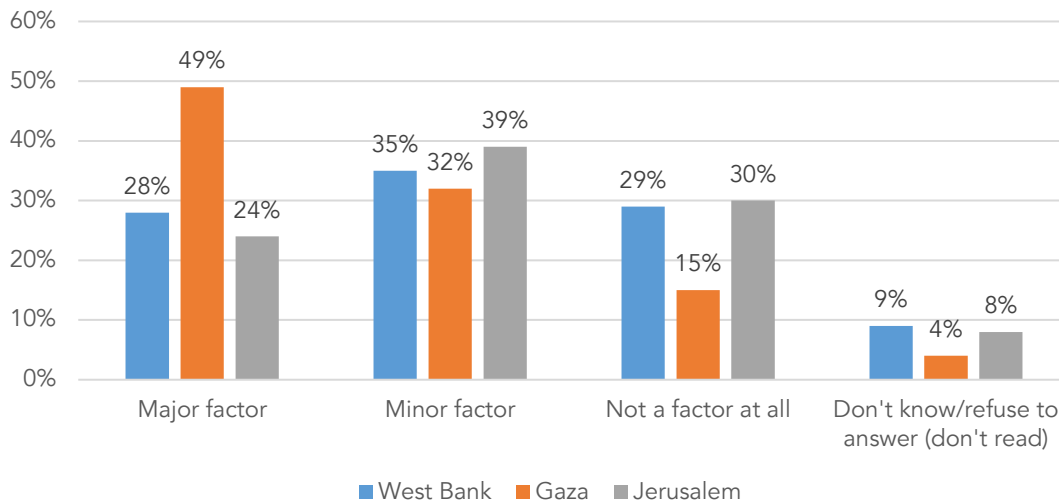

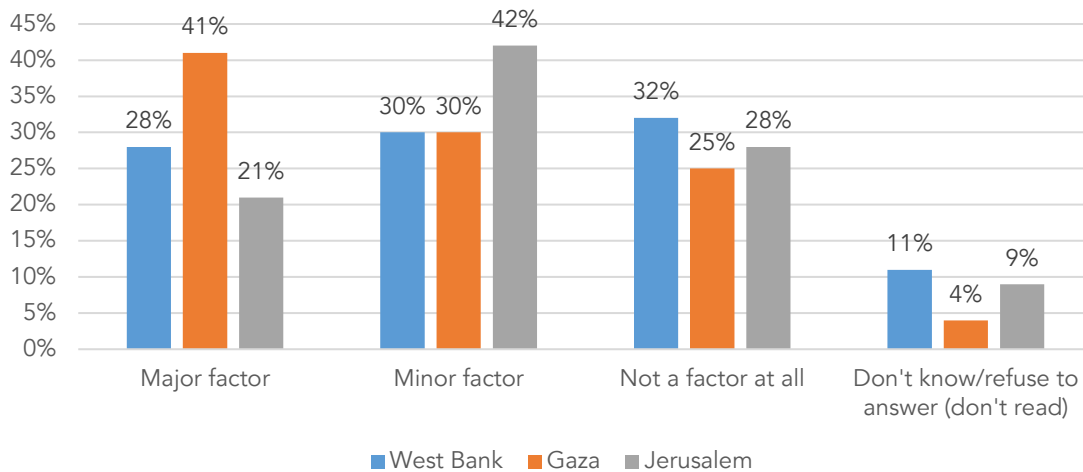

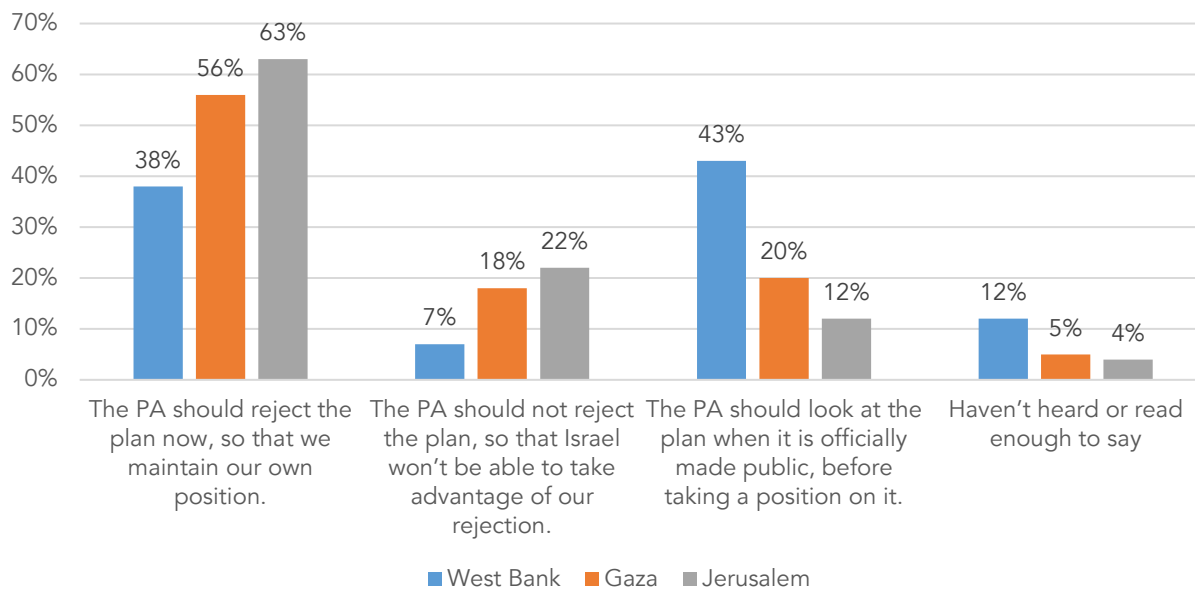

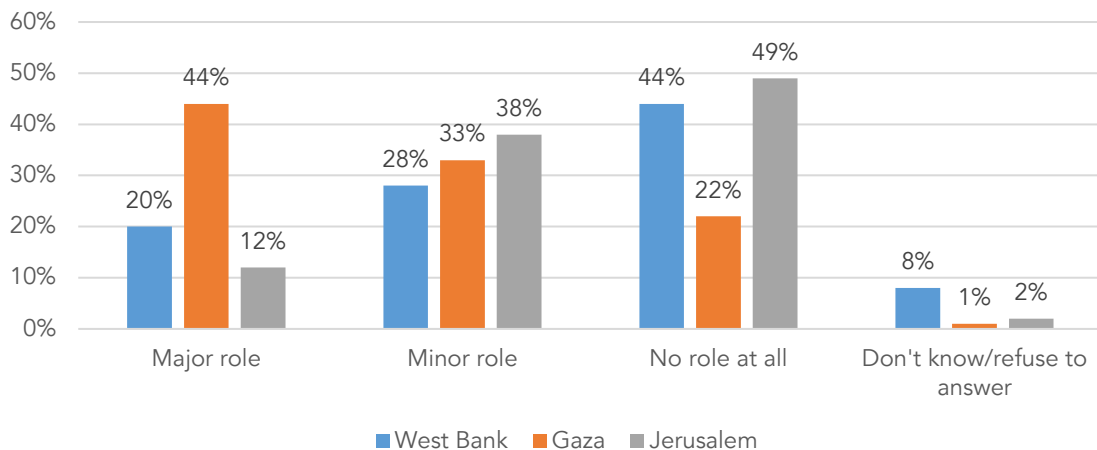
Personal views on what role Jordan should play in the future of Jerusalem

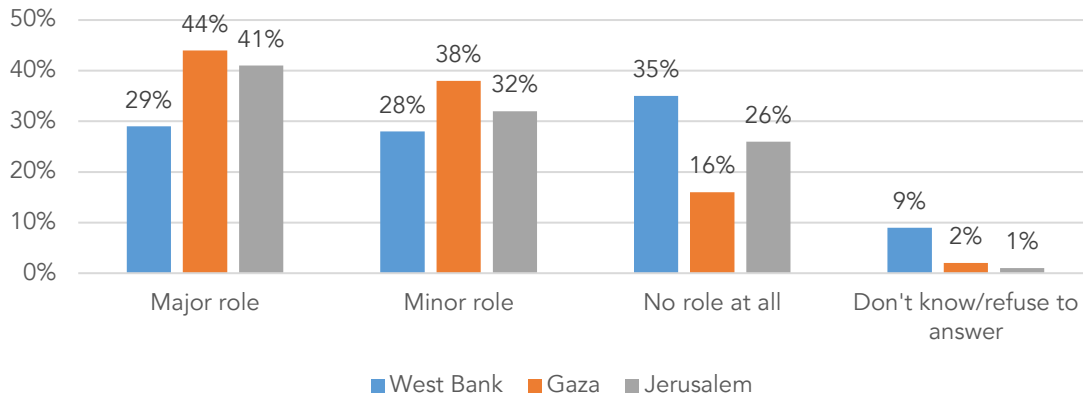
Personal views on what role Saudi Arabia should play in the future of Jerusalem

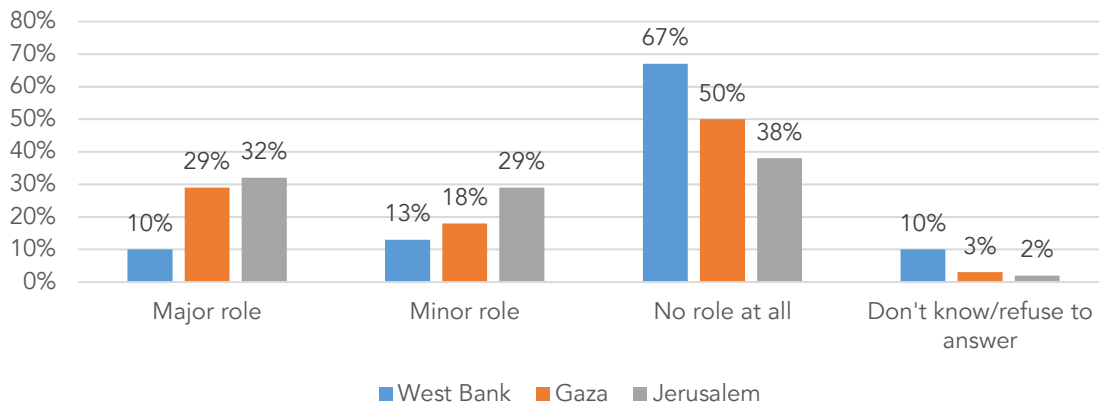

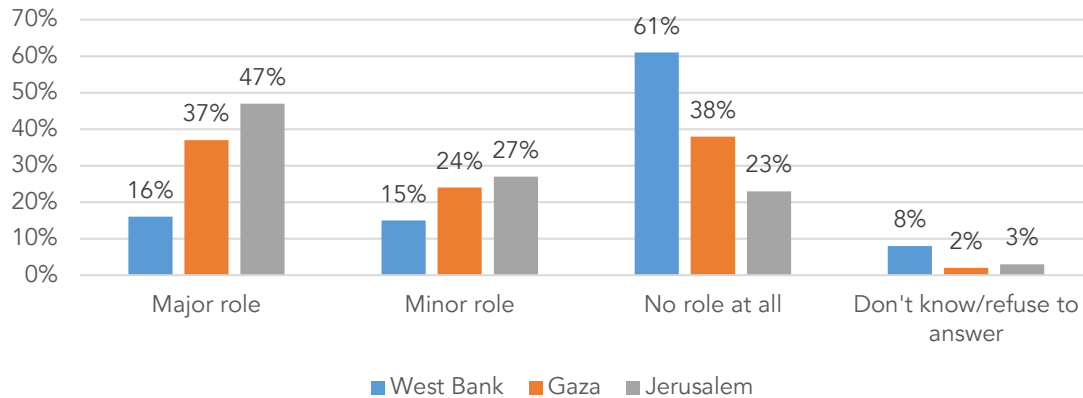

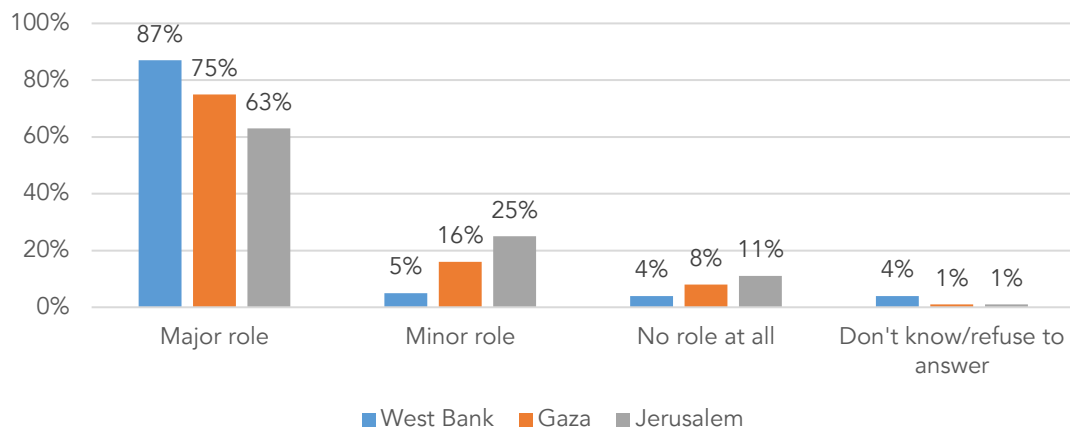
Personal views on what role the UN should play in the future of Jerusalem

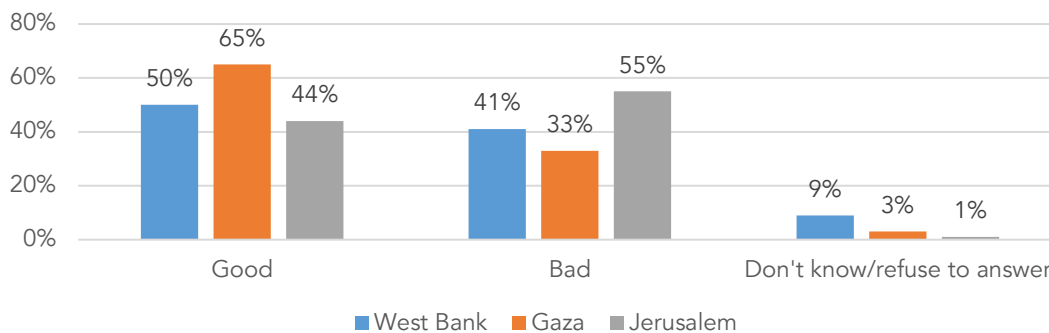

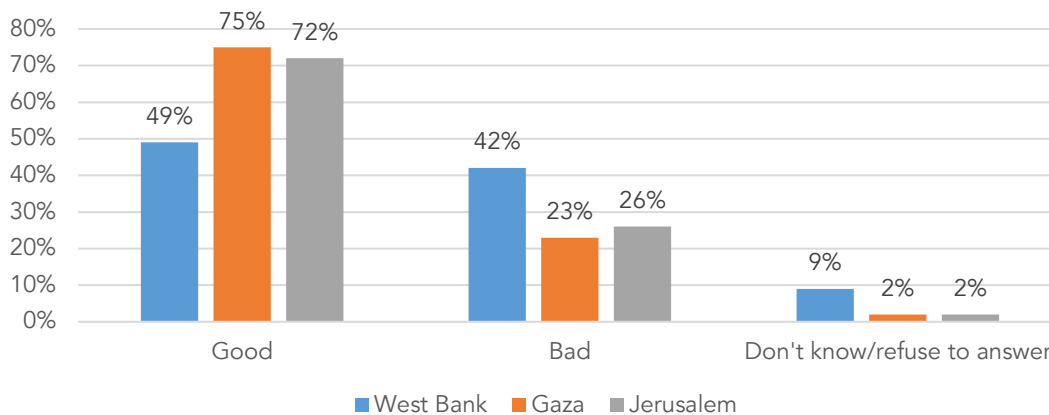

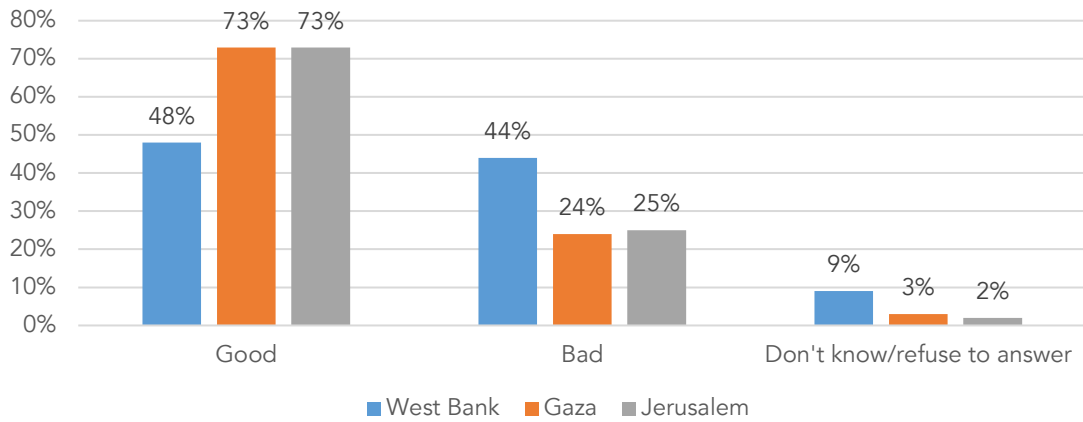
